ORDER made pursuant to Section 32 of the *Health Protection Act* (Nova Scotia)

AND WHEREAS Section 32 of the *Health Protection Act* states:

32 (1) Where a medical officer is of the opinion, upon reasonable and probable grounds, that:

- (a) a communicable disease exists or may exist or that there is an immediate risk of an outbreak of a communicable disease;
- (b) the communicable disease presents a risk to the public health; and
- (c) the requirements specified in the order are necessary in order to decrease or eliminate the risk to the public health presented by the communicable disease.

the medical officer may by written order require a person to take or to refrain from taking any action that is specified in the order in respect of a communicable disease.

WHEREAS COVID-19 has been identified as a communicable disease that presents a risk to public health as defined under s.4(b) of the *Health Protection Act*, and;

WHEREAS I am the Chief Medical Officer of Health for the Province of Nova Scotia and am of the opinion, upon reasonable and probable grounds, that

- (a) a communicable disease (COVID-19) exists; and that there is an immediate risk of an outbreak of the communicable disease;
- (b) the communicable disease presents a risk to the public health; and
- (c) the requirements specified in the order are necessary to decrease or eliminate the risk to the public health presented by the communicable disease, and;

WHEREAS as the Chief Medical Officer of Health, I have determined it necessary to issue this Order to the Class of Persons to decrease the risk to public health presented by COVID-19.

Please be advised that:

I, Dr. Robert Strang, Chief Medical Officer of Health, **order** the following:

**PART I
ISOLATION AND QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS**

1. In this Order,

(a) “self-isolate” means the requirement of any person who has COVID-19 to remain separate from others in such places and under such conditions to prevent or limit the direct or indirect transmission of COVID-19; and

(b) “self-quarantine” means the requirement of any person who has been exposed or may have been exposed to COVID-19 during its period of communicability to restrict that person’s activities in order to prevent disease transmission during the incubation period for this disease.

2. Effective July 3, 2020, all persons residing in or present in the Province of Nova Scotia who:

2.1 have travelled outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada, or reside in the same household of a person who has travelled outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada; or

2.2 are identified as a close contact of a person who has or has been diagnosed with COVID-19; or

2.3 are identified as a person diagnosed with COVID-19; or

2.4 have been tested for COVID-19 due to the presence of symptoms or as directed by public health and are awaiting the results of their test,

must:

(a) self-quarantine or self-isolate, for:

(i) the period commencing on the day of entry into Nova Scotia, or

(ii) the first day of close contact, or first day of symptoms, testing, diagnosis, and continuing thereafter for 14 consecutive days or as directed by a Medical Officer of Health, or

(iii) the period commencing on the first day they reside with the person who travelled outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada and continuing thereafter for 14 consecutive days or as directed by a Medical Officer of Health.

For greater certainty, this includes remaining in your residence or residence grounds and otherwise removing yourself from the presence of others in public while you may be infectious during the 14-day period, so that all precautions necessary to protect others are in place. Specifically, do not enter any buildings, public transportation, or other enclosed spaces (other than your residence) where other people are present.

(b) During the 14-day period, conduct yourself in such a manner as not to in any way expose any other person to infection or potential infection from COVID-19,

and follow all infection control instructions given to you on the Government of Nova Scotia's website, at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/>, or given to you by Telehealth 811 staff, public health staff or any other staff of a healthcare facility to which you may seek or receive treatment.

(c) After the 14-day period in section 2.4(a.) has lapsed, you may cease self isolation or self quarantine if you do not exhibit symptoms of COVID-19.

(d) All persons are encouraged to complete the online assessment tool should you exhibit symptoms of COVID-19.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, persons who receive a negative COVID-19 test result after being referred for testing by the online assessment tool due to the presence of COVID-like symptoms may cease self-quarantine on the date of receipt of the negative test result.

2.4.1 For the purpose of section 2.4.2, "essential travel" means travel into Nova Scotia or returning to Nova Scotia from outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada that is necessary for:

(a) work carried out by a worker that does not meet the criteria to be classified as a rotational worker, or work that requires the worker to be present at the workplace;

(b) legal custody arrangements that require parents or children to travel for visitation;

(c) essential, specialized health care treatment that is not available in the Atlantic Provinces;

(d) participation in essential legal proceedings outside the Atlantic Provinces when virtual attendance is not possible; and

(e) students studying outside the Atlantic Provinces whose primary or family residence is in Nova Scotia,

but does not include work carried out by workers who are already exempt from the self-quarantine requirements set out in section 2.1, or travel by persons travelling under a compassionate exception granted under this Order.

2.4.2 Notwithstanding section 2.1, persons who reside in the same household of a person who has travelled into Nova Scotia or returning to Nova Scotia from outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada for essential travel (the traveller) are not required to self-quarantine if the traveller, during their 14-day period of self-quarantine, meets all of the following criteria:

(a) stays at their place of residence;

- (b) has their own separate room in the home (e.g. separate bedroom, basement or attic);
- (c) sanitizes their hands before leaving the separate room;
- (d) wears a non-medical mask when outside of their separate room;
- (e) avoids being in the same space as other household members;
- (f) has their own bathroom or if sharing a bathroom then cleans high touch surfaces (e.g. doorknob, tap, toilet handle, sink, etc.) after each use;
- (g) has food and beverages prepared by others and accesses them in a non-contact manner;
- (h) does not share dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, bedding or other items with others in the home;
- (i) keeps their personal items (e.g. toothbrush, cups, cell phones, tablets, laptops, etc.) separate from those belonging to others; and
- (j) does not share food, drinks or cigarettes or any other items that are put in the mouth.

2.4.3 For greater clarity, a person who travels outside the Atlantic Provinces or Canada for travel that is not essential travel must self-quarantine in accordance with section 2.4(a)-(d).

2.4.4 For greater clarity, persons engaged in essential and non-essential travel must complete the Nova Scotia Safe Check-in form and daily digital check-ins, located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/travel/#self-declaration>.

2.5 Notwithstanding section 2.1, persons who are well and showing no symptoms of COVID-19 may enter Nova Scotia for the purposes of facilitating child sharing between parents under an order or agreement providing for joint custody, and in such instances, both the persons facilitating custody and children showing no symptoms of COVID-19 are exempt from the requirement to self-quarantine or self isolate.

2.6 Notwithstanding section 2.1, individuals who are well and showing no symptoms of COVID-19 and are engaged in a legal proceeding in Nova Scotia, whether the accused, victim, witness or party in such proceeding, may enter Nova Scotia for participation in the legal proceeding if the person:

- (a) self-isolates/self-quarantines for the period they are in Nova Scotia other than when they are in court; and
- (b) complies with the physical distancing requirements of 2 metres (6 feet) while in Nova Scotia.

2.7 An employer or contractor of any Temporary Foreign Worker entitled to enter Nova Scotia pursuant to the Federal Order in Council 2020-0184, 2020-0185 and Interim Order No.3, must first, before the Temporary Foreign Worker enters Nova Scotia, satisfy me, as Chief Medical Officer of Health, that the employer or contractor has made adequate provision for compliance with:

- (a) the federal quarantine rules applicable to the Temporary Foreign Worker; and
- (b) the self-quarantine requirements set out in section 2.4 of this Order.

2.8 In addition, the employer or contractor and the Temporary Foreign Worker must, for the duration of the entire work period in Nova Scotia:

- (a) adhere to all applicable terms and conditions of this Order; and
- (b) comply with any direction issued by me, as Chief Medical Officer of Health, or a Medical Officer of Health with respect to the Temporary Foreign Worker and their employment in Nova Scotia.

2.9 Notwithstanding section 2.1, persons who are required to travel to Nova Scotia for essential health services and one accompanying support person are exempt from the requirement to self-isolate or self-quarantine.

2.10 For the purpose of section 2.11, “rotational worker” means a person who lives in Nova Scotia and travels to work in another province, territory or country on a regular schedule.

2.11 Notwithstanding section 2.1, rotational workers must adhere to the self-quarantine requirements established by the Chief Medical Officer of health, located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/COVID-19-Directive-on-Exceptions-for-Rotational-Workers.pdf>.

2.12 Notwithstanding section 2.1, specialized workers required to enter Nova Scotia from outside of Atlantic Canada to perform urgent work that cannot be done by individuals from within the Atlantic provinces must adhere to self-quarantine requirements established by the Chief Medical Officer of Health, located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/COVID-19-Directive-on-Exceptions-for-Specialized-Workers.pdf>.

3. Workers who are essential to the movement of people and goods, and who must enter Nova Scotia as part of their duty requirements, are exempt from the requirement to self-isolate or self-quarantine set out in section 2.1, particularly:

- (a) healthy workers in the trade and transportation sector who are employed in the movement of goods and people across the Nova Scotia border by land, air, or water, including truck drivers, crew, maintenance and operational workers on any plane or train;

(b) Canadian Military and Defence Team personnel, Coast Guard, RCMP, Canadian Border Services Agency, and Canadian Security Intelligence Service; and

(c) first responders, including police, fire and EHS paramedic workers.

4. Workers exempt under section 3 must practice physical distancing of two metres (six feet) to the best of their ability, follow all public health recommendations, closely self-monitor and must self-isolate or self-quarantine should they exhibit any COVID-19 symptoms as set out in the online assessment tool.

PART II PHYSICAL DISTANCING, GATHERING LIMITS, MASKS AND FACE COVERINGS

5.1 All persons present and residing in Nova Scotia must maintain physical distancing of two metres (six feet).

5.2 Subject to the specific exceptions set out in sections 5.4 and 5.5, all persons present and residing in Nova Scotia must not participate in any gatherings of persons greater than 10, whether indoors or outdoors.

5.3 Notwithstanding section 5.1 and section 5.2, effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021:

(a) family members living in the same household:

(i) are not required to practice physical distancing; and

(ii) may gather together up to a maximum of 10 persons total in the home, including the number of immediate family members residing same the household,

(b) individuals may gather together in social groups of up to 10 persons per group without adhering to the physical distancing requirements of two metres (six feet).

5.4 Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021, persons may not engage in and businesses may not host any of the following events indoors or outdoors:

(a) social events;

(b) arts and culture events;

- (c) sports events;
- (d) special events; or
- (e) festivals,

but persons may engage in and businesses may host the following events indoors or outdoors:

- (f) faith gatherings;
- (g) weddings; or
- (h) funerals,

and all persons in attendance must practice physical distancing, except persons residing in the same household or social groups of up to 10 persons adhering to section 5.3(b).

5.4.1 Notwithstanding section 5.4, players, participants, and officials:

- (a) may engage in organized sport practice and training (recreational, amateur, and professional), and in organized arts and culture rehearsals in groups of 25 persons without practicing physical distancing,

but

- (b) are prohibited from engaging in any games, tournaments, or performances.

5.4.2 Notwithstanding section 5.4.1, participants engaged in singing and playing brass or wind instruments during a rehearsal must still adhere to the physical distancing requirements of section 5.1.

5.5 Notwithstanding sections 5.1 and 5.2, where any of the following activities are held by an existing business or organization legally operating in Nova Scotia:

- (a) faith gatherings;
- (b) weddings; or
- (c) funerals;

then:

5.5.1 the business or organization may host up to 50% of legal capacity of the indoor

establishment in which the activity is held, to an overall maximum of 100 persons; or

5.5.2 the business or organization may host up to a maximum of 150 persons if the event is outdoors, and all persons in attendance practice physical distancing, except persons residing in the same household or social groups of up to 10 persons adhering to section 5.3(b).

5.5.3 For greater clarity, the maximum number of persons and physical distancing requirements set out in sections 5.5.1 and 5.5.2 includes participants and officials.

5.5.4 Notwithstanding sections 5.4 and 5.5, no person, business or organization may host a wedding or funeral reception.

5.6 Any business or organization that hosts an activity authorized by section 5.5 is responsible for maintaining oversight of the gathering and for ensuring that all persons in attendance comply with the requirements of this Order.

5.7 For greater clarity, physical distancing and the person limit rule set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2 do not apply to the following organizations, activities, persons, or places:

(a) hospitals as defined in the *Hospitals Act* and a health authority as defined in the *Health Authorities Act*;

(b) profit, not-for-profit or government operated Department of Community Services funded organizations or representatives that are covered under the *Homes for Special Care Act* and the *Children and Family Services Act* including places of safety for children and youth, and customized placements for persons with disabilities;

(c) profit or not-for-profit Department of Health and Wellness funded long-term care facilities licensed under the *Homes for Special Care Act* or home care agencies funded under the *Homemaker Services Act*;

(d) persons providing care under the self-managed care program, supportive care program, caregiver benefit program funded by the province of Nova Scotia;

(e) persons providing support under the Independent Living Support, Supported Apartment and Supervised Apartment Programs funded by the Department of Community Services;

(f) homeless shelters receiving operational grants from the Department of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and those operated by religious and other voluntary organizations;

(g) unlicensed child-care facilities;

(h) a place designated or established under the authority of the *Correctional Services Act* or the *Youth Criminal Justice Act* (Canada) for the supervision or custody of offenders and includes community-based correctional services;

(i) any administrative tribunal, arbitration proceeding or court operating essential services in the Province under the authority of any provincial or federal enactment, including but not limited to, a justice centre or courthouse under the authority of the *Judicature Act* or a provincial court under the authority of the *Provincial Court Act* or the *Family Court Act*;

(ia) notwithstanding clause (i), the Labour Board must still comply with section 5.1 when conducting a vote under the *Trade Union Act*.

(j) Emergency Medical Care Incorporated;

(k) persons providing, servicing or repairing medical equipment, such as wheelchairs, red cross beds/equipment, home oxygen equipment;

(l) private not-for-profit community transportation providers;

(m) food production plants; and

(n) fishing vessels.

5.8 Physical distancing requirements and the person limit set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2 do not apply to the following municipal entities and their contractors:

(a) Police and Fire Services;

(b) Municipal Utilities such as water, wastewater and stormwater;

(c) Maintenance of utilities and municipal facilities;

(d) Transportation;

(e) Road maintenance/repair;

(f) Municipal ICT systems and services;

(g) Public Transit;

(h) Solid Waste, garbage and litter collection and disposal;

(i) Urban Forestry; and

(j) Municipal logistic, distribution, storage, inventory and repair services.

5.9 Physical distancing requirements and the person limit rule set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2 do not apply to the following provincial entities and their contractors:

- (a) Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal;
- (b) Road maintenance/repair; and
- (c) Government building construction and/or repair.

5.10 Effective May 1, 2020, religious services may be conducted in drive-up or parking lot settings provided persons adhere to the following conditions:

- (a) the service is conducted over speakers or by remote radio broadcast;
- (b) there is no contact between cars and no transfer of any things such as communion or collection baskets between cars;
- (c) participants remain in their respective vehicle while “attending” the service; and
- (d) participants practice physical distancing among vehicles, such that vehicles must be at least two metres (six feet) apart from each other.

5.11 Effective June 5, 2020, gatherings for sleep over camps are cancelled for the remainder of 2020.

5.12 Effective 12:01a.m. July 24, 2020, all persons must wear a mask that covers their nose and mouth as defined in section 5.15 while travelling on vehicles providing transportation to the public, including:

- (a) any municipally operated public transit, including municipally operated buses and ferries;
- (b) any public passenger vehicle licensed under the *Motor Carrier Act*, including community transit vehicles, commercial vehicles (shuttle vans), and vehicles providing charters and/or tours;
- (c) any school buses licensed under the *Motor Carrier Act* and any vehicles of any capacity operated by private schools recognized by the Minister of Education and Early Childhood Development;
- (d) commuter vehicles and courtesy vehicles as defined under the *Motor Carrier Act*, vans, mini-buses, or buses of any passenger capacity providing services to the public;
- (e) any vehicles serving residents and staff of facilities listed in section 6.1.1 and

(f) taxicabs regulated by municipalities under the authority of the *Motor Vehicle Act*.

5.13 Notwithstanding section 5.12, the following persons are exempt from the requirement to wear a mask:

(a) a person is less than 2 years of age or age 2 to 4 years and their caregiver cannot persuade them to wear a mask;

(b) a person for whom the wearing of a mask is not possible because of the person's medical condition; and

(c) a person who is reasonably accommodated by not wearing a mask in accordance with the Nova Scotia Human Rights Act.

5.14 A person may remove the mask momentarily for identification purposes when boarding any public transit set out in section 5.12.

5.15 For the purpose of sections 5.12- 5.14 and 5.17-5.19, a “mask” means a commercial medical or non-medical mask or a home-made mask made as per the PHAC instructions located at: <https://www.canada.ca/en/public-health/services/diseases/2019-novel-coronavirus-infection/prevention-risks/sew-no-sew-instructions-non-medical-masks-face-coverings.html>, that covers the nose and mouth.

5.16 For the purpose of section 5.17, a “public place” means the part of the following places accessible to the public, insofar as it is enclosed:

(a) a retail business, a shopping centre, or a building or room of a business where personal care services are provided;

(b) a restaurant or a liquor licensed establishment, including the kitchen and preparatory space of a restaurant or a liquor licensed establishment;

(c) a place of worship or faith gathering;

(d) a place where activities or services of a cultural or entertainment nature are offered;

(e) a place where sports are played or recreational activities are carried on;

(f) a rental hall or other place used to hold events, including conventions and conferences, or to hold receptions;

(g) a place where municipal or provincial government services are available to the public;

- (h) a common area, including an elevator, of a tourist accommodation establishment;
- (i) a lobby, reception area or elevator in an office building;
- (j) a common area or public space on a university or college campus;
- (k) a train or bus station, a ferry terminal, or an airport; and
- (m) common areas of a multi-residential building.

5.17 Effective 12:01a.m. July 31, 2020, all persons must wear a mask that covers their nose and mouth while present in a public place.

5.18 Notwithstanding section 5.17, a person is exempt from the requirement to wear a mask in a public place if the person:

- (a) is less than 2 years of age or age 2 to 4 years and their caregiver cannot persuade them to wear a mask;
- (b) for whom the wearing of a mask is not possible because of the person's medical condition;
- (c) is reasonably accommodated by not wearing a mask in accordance with the Nova Scotia Human Rights Act;
- (d) is in the public place receiving care or being provided a service or while participating in a physical or other activity requiring the mask be removed, in which case the person may remove the mask for the duration of the care, service or activity;
- (e) removes the mask momentarily for identification or ceremonial purposes;
- (f) is in a courtroom, jury room or secured area in a courthouse, or room where a proceeding or meeting of an administrative tribunal established by legislation is being held;
- (g) is consuming food or a beverage in a restaurant, in a food court at a shopping centre or food store, in a liquor licensed establishment, movie theatre or in any other location where food or beverages are being served used;
- (h) is a performer or officiant in the course of performing activities requiring vocalization such as talking or singing at an event or activity as described in section 5.4; or

(i) is within a room in a public place referred to in section 5.16(f) attending a business meeting with a maximum of 25 persons in attendance.

5.19 For greater certainty, the requirement to wear a mask, as set in section 5.17, is the minimum standard that persons and businesses must adhere to, and where the business's plan approved in accordance with section 13 of this Order imposes a greater standard, then that standard applies.

5.20 Notwithstanding section 5.1, any person, volunteer or employee who provides emergency first response are not required to practice physical distancing while doing so, including during an emergency, when carrying out duties or when necessary during training.

5.21.1 Notwithstanding other directions elsewhere in this Order, effective December 19, 2020 to January 8, 2021, all public schools and pre-primary programs under the jurisdiction of a regional centre for education or the Conseil Scolaire Acadien Provincial will be closed to students and pre-primary children, and upon reopening to students and pre-primary children on January 11, 2021, shall comply with Nova Scotia's Back to School Plan dated August 14, 2020, as amended from time to time and located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/back-to-school-plan.pdf>.

5.21.2 Notwithstanding section 5.21.1, effective January 4, 2021 all public schools and pre-primary programs may be open to administrators, teachers, staff at the direction of the employer.

PART III LONG TERM CARE FACILITIES AND OTHER VULNERABLE POPULATIONS

6.1.1 Notwithstanding section 5.7 (b) and (c) and subject to section 6.1.2, all for-profit or not-for-profit Department of Health and Wellness funded long-term care facilities licensed under the *Homes for Special Care Act* and all Adult Residential Centers and Regional Rehabilitation Centers funded and licensed by the Department of Community Services under the *Homes for Special Care Act* must comply with Schedule "A", "COVID-19 Management Long term Care Facilities Directive Under the Authority of the Chief Medical Officer of Health", dated December 21, 2020, as amended from time to time and located at: <https://novascotia.ca/dhw/ccs/documents/COVID-19-Management-in-Long-Term-Care-Facilities-Directive.pdf>;

6.1.2 Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021:

(a) all long term care facilities licensed by the Department of Health and Wellness and all Adult Residential Centers and Regional Rehabilitation Centers licensed by the Department of Community Services under the *Homes for Special*

Care Act are open to visitors, two designated caregivers and volunteers, in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in Schedule “A”, “COVID-19 Management Long term Care Facilities Directive Under the Authority of the Chief Medical Officer of Health”, dated December 21, 2020, as amended from time to time and located at: <https://novascotia.ca/dhw/ccs/documents/COVID-19-Management-in-Long-Term-Care-Facilities-Directive.pdf>; and

(b) all homes licensed by the Minister of Community Services for persons with disabilities under the *Homes for Special Care Act* not referred to in section 6.1.2(a) are open to visitors in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the “Covid 19 – Management in DSP Licensed Homes – Guidelines” dated December 8, 2020, and as amended from time to time; and located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coms/disabilities/index.html>.

(c) all long term care facilities licenced by the Department of Health and Wellness and all Adult Residential Centers and Regional Rehabilitation Centers licensed by the Department of Community Services under the *Homes for Special Care Act*, and all residents of such facilities must comply with the process for isolating Covid-19 positive long term care residents set out in Schedule “A”, “COVID-19 Management Long Term Care Facilities Directive Under the Authority of the Chief Medical Officer of Health”, dated December 21, 2020, as amended from time to time and located at: : <https://novascotia.ca/dhw/ccs/documents/COVID-19-Management-in-Long-Term-Care-Facilities-Directive.pdf>.

6.2.1 Effective June 26, 2020 all residents in homes licensed by the Minister of Community Services under the *Homes for Special Care Act* other than residents in Adult Residential Centers and Regional Rehabilitation Centers are permitted to have community access in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the “Covid 19 – Management in DSP Licensed Homes – Guidelines” dated December 8,, and as amended from time to time and located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coms/disabilities/index.html>.

6.2.2 Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021, all residents in homes licensed by the Minister of Health and Wellness and all Adult Residential Centers and Regional Rehabilitation Centers licensed by the Department of Community Services under the *Homes for Special Care Act* are not permitted to have community access.

6.2.3 Notwithstanding Section 6.2.2, all residents in homes licensed by the Minister of Health and Wellness and all residents in Adult Residential Centres and Regional Rehabilitation Centers licensed by the Minister of Community Services may participate in bus trips or drives by a designated caregiver, but such outings must not include

6..2.3.1 other passengers in the case of drives by a designated caregiver; or

6.2.3.2 stops or drive throughs.

6.3 For greater clarity, nothing in this Order prevents the:

- (a) discharge of a COVID-19 patient from a hospital to a long-term care or residential care facility;
- (b) transfer of a COVID-19 patient from community to a long-term care or residential care facility; or
- (c) return of a COVID-19 patient who has left a long-term care or residential care facility for healthcare services back to that facility after receiving treatment at a hospital.

6.4 Effective June 15, 2020, all day care facilities and family day care homes regulated under the *Day Care Act* centers:

- (a) may open;
 - (b) are exempt from the physical distancing requirements set out in section 5.1;
- but
- (c) must adhere to the COVID-19 Guidance for Child Care Settings, dated June 5, 2020.

6.5 For the purpose of section 6.7, “Adult Day Program” means a planned program of activities in a professional care setting designed for older adults who require supervised care during the day, or those who are isolated and lonely. Adult day care centers enable seniors to socialize and enjoy planned activities in a group setting, while still receiving needed health services. At the same time, they offer family caregivers respite from caregiving duties while knowing that their loved one is in a safe place.

6.6 Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021, all senior’s Adult Day Programs are closed, except for provision of respite care.

PART IV BUSINESSES, ORGANIZATIONS AND PROFESSIONS

7. The *Occupational Health and Safety Act*, 1996, c.7, s.1, is hereby incorporated by reference and must be followed by all employers, contractors, constructors, suppliers, owners and employees and each shall take every precaution that is reasonable in the circumstances to ensure the health and safety of all persons at or near a workplace.

8. Subject only to specific closures or limitations directed elsewhere in this Order, all not-for-profit and for-profit businesses and organizations operating or carrying on business in Nova Scotia may continue to operate but must implement physical distancing of two metres (six feet) within all workplaces, except where otherwise provided in this Order.

9. Any not-for-profit or for-profit business or organization carrying on business in Nova Scotia that cannot maintain the physical distancing requirements set out in section 5.1 of this Order must limit the number of customers or clients on its premises to no more than 10 persons at a time.

10. For greater clarity, the person limit rule referred to in section 5.2 does not apply to:

(a) businesses and organizations who can regularly maintain physical distancing requirements, including without limitation, grocery stores, pharmacies, gas stations, convenience stores, construction sites, financial institutions, agri-food and fish plants, and registered farms defined by the *Farm Registration Act*; and

(b) Canadian Blood Services blood collection clinics.

11.1 Subject to section 13, effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021:

(a) all restaurants may offer in-person dining service to a maximum of full legal capacity of the restaurant provided the operator:

(i) maintains a minimum physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) or a physical barrier between tables, booths and single seats;

(ii) no group of patrons shall have more than 10 persons at a table;

(iii) ensures patrons remain seated at their table, except while waiting to be seated, going to the bathroom, and getting ready to leave;

(iv) ceases in-person dining service to customers effective 10:00p.m.;

(v) closes by 11:00p.m.; and

(vi) ensure staff (servers and kitchen) wear masks while carrying out their work duties.

(b) all liquor licensed establishments, including liquor manufacturers (as defined in the *Liquor Control Act*) may operate at full licenced capacity provided the licensee:

(i) ensures no group of patrons have more than 10 persons per table;

(ii) maintains a minimum physical distance of 2 metres (6 feet) or a physical barrier between tables, booths and single seats;

(iii) provides food and alcohol consumption only for in-seat service;

- (iv) ensures food (excluding buffets) and alcohol is delivered to the table by staff;
- (v) ensures food and alcohol remains at the table;
- (vi) ensures patrons remain seated at their table, except while waiting to be seated, going to the bathroom, participating in a game/activity being held in the establishment and getting ready to leave;
- (vii) ensures patrons comply with the physical distancing requirements set out in section 5.1;
- (viii) ceases in-person dining service to customers effective 10:00p.m.;
- (ix) closes by 11:00p.m.; and
- (x) ensure staff (servers and kitchen) wear masks while carrying out their work duties.

(c) all personal service and fitness establishments such as hair salons, barber shops, spas, nail salons, body art establishments and gyms may operate and must conduct their business operations in accordance with the physical distancing requirements and person limit rule set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2.

11.1.1 Effective November 23, 2020, all restaurants offering full in-person dining service and liquor licensed establishments must collect and maintain records of each patron contact information that includes the following minimum data:

- (a) name(s);
- (b) contact telephone number;
- (c) date; and
- (d) time

the patron was at the restaurant and liquor licensed establishment.

11.1.2 Restaurants and liquor licensed establishments must retain information collected under section 11.1.1 for a period of 30 calendar days and must destroy it on the following day immediately thereafter.

11.1.3 Restaurants and liquor licensed establishments must provide the information collected under section 11.1.1 to the Chief Medical Officer of Health or his delegate in electronic form.

11.1.4 Restaurants and liquor licensed establishments must only use the information collected under section 11.1.1 for the purpose of provision to the Chief Medical Officer of Health in compliance with this Order and may not use it for any other purpose.

11.2 Notwithstanding clause 11.1, liquor licensed establishment patrons may play darts, pool or bowling, and in doing so, must adhere to the physical distancing requirements of section 5.1.

11.3 Owner/operators of liquor licensed establishments may hold dart, pool, or bowling regular league games and tournaments, but in doing so, must adhere to requirements established by the Chief Medical Officer of Health.

11.4 Notwithstanding section 11.1, restaurants and liquor licensed establishments may offer take-out, delivery, and drive through service to patrons after 11:00p.m.

12. Subject to section 13, effective June 5, 2020:

(a) all self-regulated health professions, may provide in-person services or virtual care services if they:

(i) are authorized to provide this care within their scope of practice; and

(ii) have adopted a compliance plan in accordance with the directions established by their governing college and approved by the Chief Medical Officer of Health;

(b) all unregulated health care providers engaged in private practice may provide in-person or virtual care services within their scope of practice;

(c) all veterinarians, including veterinary surgeons and veterinary physicians engaged in for-profit and not-for-profit practice may provide in-person care to animals as determined by the Nova Scotia Veterinary Medicine Association,

but must comply with the physical distancing and person limit rule as set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2.

13. Effective June 5, 2020:

(a) All not for-profit, for-profit businesses, organizations and professions named in Part IV of this Order shall, as a requirement of their ongoing operations, develop and comply with a Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan, as amended from time to time.

(b) In addition to the physical distancing requirements and person limit rule set out in sections 5.1 and 5.2, the Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan required by subsection (a) shall address the following:

- (i) how to work and interact with customers;
- (ii) physical distancing in the workplace;
- (iii) cleaning;
- (iv) equipment;
- (v) preparing employees to return to work;
- (vi) preparing for customers or clients; and
- (vii) monitoring and communicating of plan,

and may be substantially similar to those proposals listed in Schedule “B”, located at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/Schedule-B-HPA-Order.pdf> for similar businesses or health professionals and must be made available for review by the Chief Medical Officer of Health; and

(c) All businesses or regulated health professionals that are a member of an association listed in Schedule “B” must adopt as their Workplace COVID-19 Prevention Plan the proposal submitted by their association and must be made available for review by the Chief Medical Officer of Health.

13.1 Notwithstanding sections 9 to 11.3 of this Order, effective 12:01a.m. November 26, 2020 up to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021, businesses operating in the geographic regions of:

- (a) Halifax Peninsula – Chebucto;
- (b) Bedford-Sackville; and
- (c) Dartmouth Southeastern,

collectively “the geographic region”, as set out in the map locate at: <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/Halifax-County-Map.pdf> must adhere to the following:

13.1.1 All restaurants and liquor licensed establishments are

- (a) restricted to providing food and alcohol take-out and delivery service only; and
- (b) prohibited from offering in-person dining service.

13.1.2 Wineries, distilleries and breweries are prohibited from offering in-person tastings, samplings or in-person dining but may continue to sell their product from their storefront, for delivery or curbside pickup.

14. Video Lottery Terminals and Casinos located in the geographic regions set out in section 13.1 may not operate.

15.1 Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020 to 11:59p.m. January 10, 2021, all not-for-profit and for-profit fitness, recreational and leisure facilities may:

(a) open; and

(b) offer outdoor fitness classes at full capacity, while ensuring three metres (nine feet) physical distance between participants during high intensity activities.

15.2 Notwithstanding section 15.1, all not-for-profit and for-profit fitness facilities such as gyms and yoga studios may only operate at 50% of capacity, while ensuring three metres (nine feet) distance between participants during high intensity activities.

16. Effective 12:01a.m. December 21, 2020, the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia, all museums and public libraries may open and operate at full capacity, while adhering to the physical distancing and other public health requirements set out in this Order.

17.1 For the purpose of sections 17.2. and 17.3, “retail business” means a business operating on an ongoing basis at a fixed location primarily selling goods or products for use or consumption by individual purchasers.

17.2. A retail business that engages in the retail sale, or rental, of items to the public shall comply with the following conditions:

(a) the number of persons occupying any retail space that is open to the public in the business does not exceed 25 per cent of the allowable occupancy or 160 square feet per person of the particular retail space;

(b) in accordance with section 5.1, members of the public must be able to maintain a physical distance of at least two metres (six feet) from every other person in the place of business, except those persons residing in the same household;

(c) no patrons may be permitted to line up inside or line up or congregate outside of the establishment unless they are,

(i) maintaining a physical distance of at least two metres (six feet) from other persons inside or outside the establishment, and

(ii) wearing a mask or face covering in a manner that covers their nose and mouth, unless they are entitled to any of the exceptions set out in section 5.18;

and

(d) the person responsible for the place of business must ensure that music is not played at the place of business at a decibel level that exceeds the level at which normal conversation is possible, and in any event no greater than 50 db.

17.3 Shopping malls shall comply with the following conditions:

(a) in accordance with section 5.1, members of the public must be able to maintain a physical distance of at least two metres (six feet) from every other person in the shopping mall, except those persons residing in the same household;

(b) no patrons may be permitted to line up inside or line up or congregate outside of the shopping mall unless they are,

(i) maintaining a physical distance of at least two metres (six feet) from other groups of persons inside or outside the shopping mall, and

(ii) wearing a mask or face covering in a manner that covers their mouth, nose and chin, unless they are entitled to any of the exceptions set out in section 5.18;

(c) no line up outside any one retail space located inside the shopping mall shall exceed 10 persons;

(d) the person responsible for the shopping mall must ensure that:

(i) music is not played at the place of business at a decibel level that exceeds the level at which normal conversation is possible, and in any event no greater than 50 db;

(ii) patrons are not permitted to loiter in any area of the shopping mall; and

(iii) directional markings are provided to manage the flow of pedestrians within the mall,

(e) the non-retail public areas in the mall shall be closed, other than for traffic flow/store access and washroom access; and

(f) notwithstanding clause 13.1.9(e), food courts may open but shall adhere to the following:

- (i) a minimum of two metres (six feet) is maintained between patrons seated at food court tables and between other patrons in the food court; and
- (ii) each restaurant may offer takeout food service.

PART V EXCEPTIONS

18. Under exceptional circumstances and under the authority granted to me as the Chief Medical Officer of Health under Part I of the *Health Protection Act*, I may exercise discretion to grant an exception to any term and condition of this Order.


PART VI PENALTIES

19. Any direction provided by a medical officer of health to a person, business, organization or other entity pertaining to COVID-19 and the terms and conditions of this Order must be followed.

19. Failure to comply with this health protection order may be considered a breach of this Order issued under the *Health Protection Act* and may result in penalties under the *Act*.

This Order remains in effect until notice is provided by myself, as Chief Medical Officer of Health, under the authority granted under Part I of the *Health Protection Act* and will be updated from time to time.

Nova Scotia Civil Procedure Rules
Amendment (Applications)
December 11, 2020

The following Rules and Forms are amended as follows:

1. The words “longer hearings” in Rule 5.01(4) are replaced with “a dispute that can be ready for hearing within two years and will take no more than four days to be heard”.
2. The following Rule 5.06(3) is added to Rule 5.06:
 - (3) Two days before the hearing of an application in chambers in which a respondent has not filed a document in response, the applicant must either file an affidavit of service proving required notice or advise the prothonotary that notice has not been effected.
3. Rule 5.07(3) is amended by removing the word “twenty-five” and substituting “thirty-five”.
4. Rule 5.07(3) is further amended by adding, immediately before the period, the phrase “, and the date may not be adjourned unless a judge orders otherwise”.
5. Rule 5.07(4)(b) is amended by adding “and, if not, all details known to counsel about other witnesses” immediately before the semi-colon.
6. Rules 5.07(5)(b) to (d) are re-lettered (c) to (e) and the following Rule 5.07(5)(b) is added:
 - (b) if the applicant intends to provide evidence from a witness the applicant cannot name, the notice must provide information about the intended witness, an explanation for the inability to name the witness, and the justification for proceeding by application, rather than action, without naming the witness at the time of the motion for directions.
7. The following Rule 5.07(7) is added to Rule 5.07:
 - (7) Two days before the hearing of the motion for directions in an application in which a respondent has not filed a document in response, the applicant must either file an affidavit of service proving required notice or advise the prothonotary that notice has not been effected.

8. Rule 5.08(1) is amended by removing the word “fifteen” and substituting “twenty-five”.
9. Rule 5.10(1) is amended by removing the word “fifteen” and substituting “twenty-five”.
10. The following Rule 5.10(4) is added to Rule 5.10:
 - (4) Two days before the hearing of the motion for directions in an application in which a respondent has made a claim against another respondent, the claiming respondent must either file an affidavit of service proving required notice to the other respondent or advise the prothonotary that notice has not been effected.
11. Rules 5.13(2) and (3) are renumbered (7) and (8) and the following Rules (2) to (6) are added to Rule 5.13:
 - (2) A judge who hears a motion for directions must, after examining the information in the materials filed on the application and hearing the parties, determine each of the following:
 - (a) whether the information is sufficient to warrant giving directions and setting a date for the hearing of the application;
 - (b) whether the information is such as to warrant giving only some directions, and adjourning the motion for further information and further directions;
 - (c) whether the information shows that the application may need to be converted to an action under Rule 6 - Choosing Between Action and Application.
 - (3) A judge who adjourns the hearing of a motion for directions may also adjourn setting a time, date, and place for the hearing of the application.
 - (4) A judge hearing a motion for directions, or another motion concerning the course of an application, and who is satisfied on the materials filed in the application that it is obvious the application should be converted to an action may, on the judge’s own motion without a further hearing, make an order under Rule 6.03(1) of Rule 6 – Choosing Between Action and Application.
 - (5) A judge may adjourn a motion for directions and give directions for continuing the motion in combination with a hearing under Rule 6 – Choosing Between Action and Application.

- (6) The judge adjourning a motion for directions must endeavour to preside at the adjourned hearing, if that is convenient for the judge and for the court.
12. Rule 5.13(1) is replaced with the following:
- (1) The motion for directions must be heard in chambers, unless a judge directs otherwise, and the lawyer who expects to act as lead counsel for a party must be present, unless the chambers judge permits otherwise.
13. Rule 5.13(5)(d), formerly in Rule 5.13(2), is replaced with the following:
- (d) order discovery of a witness only if the witness is expected to provide an affidavit or if the witness has relevant information but refuses to cooperate in the production of an affidavit;
14. Rules 5.13(7)(e) to (j), formerly in Rule 5.13(2), are renumbered (f) to (k) and Rule 5.13(7)(e) is added as follows:
- (e) set a deadline for discovery of a witness who is to provide an affidavit that is after the deadline for providing the witnesses' affidavit, authorize a discovery subpoena for an uncooperative witness, and give directions for the conduct of the discovery such as directions limiting the time or scope of examination;
15. Rules 5.13(2)(k) to (n) of the former Rule 5.13(2), now duplicate Rule 5.13(7)(k) and the rest of the paragraphs in Rule 5.13(7), are replaced with the following:
- (k) ascertain the volume of documents that are likely to be in evidence;
- (l) set deadlines before the finish date for filing the applicant's affidavits, the respondent's affidavits, an applicant's rebuttal affidavit, and a notice of objection to admissibility;
- (m) set deadlines for filing briefs;
- (n) set the time, date, and place for the hearing of the application;
- (o) set the time, date, and place for a settlement conference, if the parties want one;
- (p) direct further appearances before that judge or another judge;

- (q) give any other directions, or make any other order, needed to organize the application.

16. Rules 5.16 to 5.24 are re-numbered 5.19 to 5.27 and the following Rules 5.16 to 5.18 are added to Rule 5 - Application:

Notice of objection to admissibility

5.16(1) A party who wishes to object to the admission of an averment, an exhibit, or a part of either in an affidavit must file a notice of objection to admissibility before the finish date.

- (2) The notice of objection to admissibility must contain the standard heading written in accordance with Rule 82 - Administration of Civil Proceedings, be entitled “Notice of Objection to Admissibility (Application in Court)”, be dated and signed, and include all of the following:

- (a) a statement identifying the affidavit containing an averment, exhibit, or part said to be inadmissible under the rules of evidence;
- (b) particulars of the averment or exhibit and a summary of the objected averment or exhibit;
- (c) the ground of the objection including the rule of evidence relied upon.

- (3) The notice of objection to admissibility may be in Form 5.16.

- (4) A party who does not file a notice of objection may not rely on the rules of evidence to exclude an averment or an exhibit in an affidavit filed in an application in court.

- (5) A judge may not exclude an averment, an exhibit, or a part of either that is not the subject of a notice of objection to admissibility, unless the judge is satisfied both that the averment, exhibit, or part is inadmissible and that its remaining part of the record compromises the integrity of the fact-finding process.

Finish date

5.17(1) The finish date in an application in court is sixty days before the date set for the hearing of the application.

- (2) Each party must complete all prehearing procedures in an application in court, including making required disclosure, completing permitted discovery, and filing all affidavits before the finish date.
- (3) A failure to complete a prehearing procedure before the finish date, or before an earlier deadline set by a judge, that causes prejudice to another party may be dealt with under Rule 88 - Abuse of Process.

Prehearing conference

- 5.18(1)** On the motion for direction or afterwards, the court must schedule a prehearing conference with the judge who is expected to hear an application in court.
- (2) The hearing judge may direct that the prehearing conference be held in a courtroom, chambers, or a conference room.
 - (3) A lawyer who is to act as lead counsel for a party must participate in the conference, unless the hearing judge permits otherwise.
 - (4) At the prehearing conference, the hearing judge must ascertain whether the parties are ready for the hearing of the application and, if so, organize the hearing, which tasks may include any of the following:
 - (a) assess whether the time scheduled for the hearing of the application is sufficient and, if not, schedule more time, adjourn the hearing to new dates, adjourn the hearing without new dates and schedule a hearing of a motion by a party, or the judge's own motion, under Rule 6 - Choosing Between Action and Application, or convert the application to an action on the judge's own motion during the hearing of the motion for directions;
 - (b) ascertain whether all necessary prehearing procedures are complete;
 - (c) ascertain objections to admissibility of an averment or exhibit that require judicial determination and, unless the judge determines that doing so would harm the integrity of the evidence upon which the application is to be determined, dismiss an objection not supported by a notice of objection filed before the finish date;
 - (d) if there is a procedural or an evidentiary dispute, determine the dispute, appoint a time before the hearing of the application for the hearing judge to determine the dispute, allow for time during the hearing for determination, adjourn the hearing of the application with or without

allowing for determination of the dispute during the time in which the hearing had been scheduled, or schedule a hearing under Rule 6 - Choosing Between Action and Application;

- (e) review the affidavits that have been filed and ascertain whether an anticipated affidavit has not been filed;
 - (f) inquire into intended cross-examination and set limits on the subjects and duration of cross-examination and re-examination;
 - (g) inquire into intended motions usually to be heard by the application judge, such as for an order excluding witnesses pending cross-examination and re-examination, and determine the motion or give directions for when it is to be heard;
 - (h) inquire into needs of counsel, a party, or a witness and their accommodation, such as examination by video conference or assistance for those who do not hear well;
 - (i) ascertain that briefs have been filed, or will be filed, by the applicable deadlines.
- (5) The court may schedule the prehearing conference with a judge other than the hearing judge, if the hearing judge is not available.
17. The word “five” in the heading and again in the body of Rule 5.24 is replaced with “two”.
18. The phrase “, that can be tried or heard in four days or less and within two years after the day it was started,” is added after the word “claim” in Rule 6.02(2).
19. The word “either” in Rule 6.02(4) is changed to “any”, the period at the end of Rule 6.02(4)(b) is changed to a semi-colon, and the following Rule 6.02(4)(c) is added to Rule 6.02(4):
- (c) the proceeding cannot be tried or heard less than two years from the day it was started.
20. Rule 6.02(5)(d) is re-lettered (e) and the following Rule 6.02(5)(d) is added to Rule 6.02(5):

(d) it can be heard in four days or less;

21. Rule 6.03 is renumbered 6.04 and the following new Rule 6.03 is added to Rule 6 - Choosing Between Action and Application:

Judge's own motion

6.03(1) A judge who hears a motion in a proceeding, including a motion for directions in an application in court, and who becomes satisfied that it is obvious the proceeding should be converted may convert the proceeding on the judge's own motion.

(2) A judge who presides at a motion for directions in an application in court, and who is satisfied on the information provided for the motion that the application will not be heard within two years after it was started or that the hearing will require more than four days, may convert the application to an action on the judge's own motion.

22. Rules 14.14(2) to (5) are replaced with the following:

(2) A judge may designate a manager for a corporate party who fails to do so in an action.

(3) A judge may substitute a manager for a corporate party in an action who makes an unreasonable designation, such as designating a person who has no real connection with the party's claim or defence even though such a person is available and able to act as manager.

(4) A designated manager in an action must, before being discovered, become informed about relevant information available to the party.

(5) A corporate party to an application need not designate a manager unless a judge directs otherwise, and the judge may set the terms that apply to the manager.

23. The phrase "to an action" is added after the word "party" in Rule 19.01(1).

24. Rules 19.02 to 19.10 are renumbered 19.03 to 19.11 and the following Rule 19.02 is added:

Interpretation of Rule 19

19.02 In this Rule, "party" means a party to an action unless the word is followed by the phrase "to an application".

25. Rules 19.10 and 19.11, formerly 19.09 and 19.10, are renumbered 19.11 and 19.12 and the following Rule 19.10 is added:

Interrogatories in an application

19.10 A judge may permit interrogatories in an application and set the terms under which the interrogatories are asked and answered.

26. The phrase “, to an action and a party to an application,” is added immediately after the first use of the word “party” in Rule 19.11.
27. The title “**Witnesses for applicant**” in Form 5.07 is changed to “**Named witnesses for applicant**” and the following paragraph is added immediately after that paragraph:

Unnamed witness for applicant

[The applicant intends only to produce evidence from the witnesses named above./
Provide information about an unnamed witness, an explanation for the applicant’s inability to name the witness, and a justification for proceeding by application, rather than action, without naming the witness at this time.]

28. The attached Form 5.16 - **Notice of Objection to Admissibility (Application in Court)** is added to **Part 22 - Forms**.
29. The word “action” in the first averment in Form 15.03A, Form 15.03B, Form 16.09A, and Form 16.09B is changed to [*action/application in court*].

The following Rules are amended as follows:

1. Rule 4.22(1) is amended by adding the word “unexpired” before the first use of the word “action”.
2. The phrase “at appearance day” in Rule 7.10(j) is changed to “by appearance motion”.
3. The phrase “on appearance day” in Rule 24.06(1) is changed to “hearing an appearance motion”.
4. The following phrase is added to Rule 27.01(2) after the word “correspondence”: “, other than a motion to grant an order consented to by all interested persons,”.
5. Rule 36.04 is renumbered 36.04(1) and the following Rule (2) is added to Rule 36.04:

(2) A judge may withdraw permission for a representative to act without counsel, and require the representative to appoint a solicitor of record.
6. Clause 13 of the Amendment (Appearance) and clause 25 of the Amendment (Miscellaneous), both made by the judges of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia on January 24, 2020 are removed for redundancy, such that Rules 84.02(4)(e) to (g) read as follows:

 - (e) the expiry of an action as declared by the prothonotary;
 - (f) information about a document filed by the court in the proceeding, such as a decision or a notice of prothonotary’s motion, including the title of the document and the date it is filed;
 - (g) information about an instrument issued by the court in the proceeding, such as an order or a release of judgment, including the title of the instrument and the date it is issued.

7. Rule 71.05(3) is amended by substituting the words *Adult Capacity and Decision-making Act* to replace the words *Incompetent Persons Act*.

Amendment (Mortgages)
December 11, 2020

The following Rules, Forms, and Practice Memorandum #1 – Foreclosure Procedures are amended as follows:

1. The period after Rule 8.02(1)(d) is changed to a semi-colon and the following Rule 8.02(1)(e) is added to Rule 8.02:
 - (e) the proceeding does not include an outstanding claim for enforcement of security, such as a claim for foreclosure, foreclosure and sale, or possession in relation to a mortgage loan.
2. The comma after the word “notification” in Rule 8.02(2)(a) is removed.
3. The period at the end of Rule 35.12(3)(f) is replaced with a semi-colon and the following Rules (g) and (h) are added to Rule 35.12:
 - (g) in a claim for simple foreclosure, notice of the amount at which the court has settled the mortgage debt;
 - (h) in a claim for simple foreclosure, notice that the subsequent encumbrancers may be entitled to redeem the property under foreclosure by paying the mortgage debt and information about how that may be done.
4. Rules 72.01(1) and (2) are replaced with the following:
 - (1) This Rule establishes procedures for the remedies of foreclosure, sale, and possession by auction or by private sale, simple foreclosure, redemption, and other remedies in relation to mortgages.
 - (2) For the purposes of regulating remedies under paragraph 46(b) of the *Judicature Act*, this Rule provides for the calculation of a deficiency judgment in a proceeding for foreclosure, sale, and possession, including charges that may be added to principal and interest and those that must be excluded.
 - (3) In this Rule 72, “simple foreclosure” and “order for simple foreclosure” mean both of the initial order for foreclosure and the final order for foreclosure provided in this Rule.

5. The phrase “or simple foreclosure” is added after the word “possession” in Rule 72.02.
6. The phrase “in accordance with” in Rule 72.03(3) is replaced with “or for simple foreclosure, under”.
7. Rule 72.04 is renumbered 72.04(1) and the phrase “, or for simple foreclosure,” is added after the word “possession”.
8. The following Rules 72.04(2), (3) and (4) are added to Rule 72.04:
 - (2) A judge may not order a sale subject to a prior mortgage unless the prior mortgagee provides a statement that satisfies the judge as to the amount owing on the prior mortgage and states the terms on which the prior mortgagee will forebear enforcing its mortgage, such as any of the following:
 - (a) the entire mortgage debt comes due on the closing of a sale under an order for foreclosure, sale, and possession;
 - (b) the entire debt comes due on a sale to a third party at arms-length from the foreclosing mortgagee;
 - (c) an ultimate purchaser, who is approved by the prior mortgagee, may assume the debt owing on the prior mortgage at the rate, and in the manner, provided in the prior mortgage.
 - (3) A judge who is satisfied that the amount of the debt owing on the prior mortgage has been proved may grant an order for foreclosure, sale, and possession that allows for payment of the prior mortgage debt out of the proceeds of sale in priority to the debt under foreclosure.
 - (4) A judge may grant an order for foreclosure, sale, and possession, or for simple foreclosure, that recognizes that the sale, or foreclosure, is subject to the prior mortgage.
9. The phrase “, or for simple foreclosure,” is added to Rule 72.05(1) after the word “possession”.
10. The title to Rule 72.07 is changed to “**Order for foreclosure, sale, and possession**”.
11. Rule 72.07(3) is repealed and Rules 72.07(4), (5), (6), and (7) are renumbered (3), (4), (5), and (6).

12. Rule 72.11(6) is renumbered (7) and the following new Rule 72.11(6) is added to Rule 72:
- (6) Reasonable expenses authorized by the mortgage and incurred before the effective date may be allowed, but not expenses incurred after the effective date except for either of the following kinds of expenses:
- (a) direct expenses of a sale to a third party, such as a real estate agent's commission;
 - (b) expenses deducted on an accounting for income that results in a net credit against the mortgage debt, such as expenses of renting out mortgaged property that are deducted from gross rent to produce a credit to the mortgage debt.
13. Rule 72.13(1) is renumbered (4), and the words before the colon are replaced with the following:
- (4) The amount realized from the security, or the value of the secured property, must be ascertained in the applicable of the following circumstances
14. Rule 72.13(2) is renumbered (5), and the following new Rules 72.13(1), (2), and (3) are added to Rule 72.13:
- (1) A judge must calculate the deficiency by ascertaining the amount of the mortgage debt and ascertaining the applicable of the following credits, and subtracting the credits from the debt:
- (a) the amount realized from the secured property, if it has been sold to an arms-length purchaser;
 - (b) the value of the secured property, if it is in the control of the plaintiff.
- (2) The amount of the mortgage debt may be ascertained by including the following amounts, but no other amounts even if they are authorized by the mortgage instrument:
- (a) outstanding principal;
 - (b) mortgage interest to the effective date of the default judgment;

- (c) interest under the *Interest on Judgments Act* after the effective date;
 - (d) reasonable expenses authorized by the mortgage instrument and incurred before the effective date.
- (3) The amount of the mortgage debt must not include either of the following:
- (a) expenses for protecting the property before the effective date that are not evidenced by an invoice or receipt for materials or work issued by the person who actually supplied the materials or did the work;
 - (b) expenses for protecting the property after the effective date.
15. Rule 72.16 is renumbered 72.18, and Rule 72.15 is replaced with the following Rules 72.15, 72.16 and 72.17:

Simple foreclosure

72.15 A judge may grant an initial order for foreclosure that sets the terms under which foreclosure occurs, including provisions for the hearing of a motion for a final order, and a judge may grant the final order giving effect to the foreclosure.

Initial foreclosure order

72.16(1) A judge who is satisfied on each of the following may grant an initial foreclosure order:

- (a) the mortgage instrument and the mortgage debt have been proved;
- (b) title to the mortgaged property has been adequately proved, such that the judge is reasonably sure that all interests in the property, and any title defects, are known;
- (c) necessary parties have been joined;
- (d) the defendant has been notified in accordance with Rule 31 – Notice, or as directed by the judge, and any party other than the defendant who should be notified has been adequately notified;
- (e) no defendant has defended the proceeding or a defence has been determined in favour of the plaintiff;

- (f) the amount proposed to be settled as due under the mortgage is no greater than the claim of which the defendant is notified.
- (2) The amount of the mortgage debt may be settled for simple foreclosure by a judge or by referring the taking of accounts to a referee.
 - (3) A judge who refers the taking of accounts because of a failure to provide a reliable statement of account, or a reliable summary, may order the moving party to pay the cost of the reference and not to charge it to the mortgage debt.
 - (4) The initial order for foreclosure must provide each of the following, unless the judge who grants the order directs otherwise:
 - (a) particulars of the mortgage including the parties, date of execution, registration details, and liability secured;
 - (b) a declaration that the mortgagor is in default of the term for payment or of some other term that justifies foreclosure;
 - (c) settlement of the amount due on the mortgage as proved by the plaintiff, but not greater than the amount claimed in pleadings of which the defendant has notice;
 - (d) a time, date, and place for hearing a motion for a final order for foreclosure, and a declaration that the equity of redemption in the mortgaged property will be foreclosed when a final order for foreclosure is issued;
 - (e) delivery of a notice of motion for a final foreclosure order to the defendant, and of a notice to subsequent encumbrancer to each subsequent encumbrancer, and of a notice as prescribed by the judge to such other person as the judge may direct;
 - (f) an abbreviated description of the mortgaged property to be attached to the notices;
 - (g) a requirement that the plaintiff record documents showing the mortgage debt is satisfied when the property is redeemed, or the plaintiff ceases to hold title in its own right or through an assignee who holds title pending sale.

Final foreclosure order

- 72.17(1)** A judge who is satisfied on each of the following may grant a final foreclosure order:
- (a) notice of the motion was delivered to the defendant as required by the initial order for foreclosure;
 - (b) a required notice to subsequent encumbrancer, and any other notice required by the initial order for foreclosure, have been delivered in the required manner;
 - (c) no defendant, and no subsequent encumbrancer, has defended the proceeding or any defence has been determined in favour of the plaintiff.
- (2)** The final order for foreclosure must provide each of the following, unless the judge who grants the order directs otherwise:
- (a) a declaration that the interest and equity of redemption of the defendant and of all persons claiming through the defendant, or the mortgagor if the mortgagor is not a defendant, in property described in the order are forever barred and foreclosed;
 - (b) a declaration that no prior interest, title defect, or cloud on title has been made apparent to the court or a declaration describing a prior interest, title defect, or cloud and stating that there are no others that have been made apparent;
 - (c) an order for possession of the foreclosed property;
 - (d) approval of a description suitable for an instrument by which the plaintiff, or its assign, may convey the foreclosed property;
 - (e) a requirement that the plaintiff record the order in the parcel registry or under the *Registry Act*;
 - (f) a requirement that the plaintiff report to the court when it complies with its obligation to record documents showing the mortgage debt is satisfied immediately after the plaintiff, or its assignee, ceases to hold title to the foreclosed property.

16. The phrase “the sheriff” in the text under the title “**How foreclosure will happen**” in Form 35.12 is replaced with “*the sheriff*/name of appointed auctioneer”.
17. The following is added after the first paragraph under the title “**How foreclosure will happen**” in Form 35.12:

[OR]

The court settled the amount of the mortgage debt in an initial foreclosure order, a copy of which is available from the undersigned. The order also sets a deadline for a person to redeem the property by paying the mortgage debt. Your interest will be foreclosed if the debt remains unpaid after the deadline passes, unless you defend the claim, contest the claim, or redeem the property.

[Use the first unless the claim is for simple foreclosure.]

18. The following is added after the last paragraph in Form 35.12:

[Redemption

You may have a right to redeem the property under foreclosure by paying the mortgage debt. You may do so by contacting the undersigned, who will provide you with a copy of the order settling the amount of the mortgage and will give you directions for paying the mortgage debt before the deadline.

FOR SIMPLE FORECLOSURE ONLY]

19. The word “Sheriff’s” at the end of Form 35.12 is replaced with “*Sheriff’s/Appointed Auctioneer’s*”.
20. Paragraphs 3.3(a), (b), and (c) of the Practice Memorandum are re-lettered (b), (c), and (d) and the following paragraph 3.3(a) is added:
 - (a) The Rules now preclude recovery of protective disbursements incurred after the effective date of the default judgment, which is fifteen days after the auction or another event provided in Rule 72.11(3). An exception is made for direct expenses of resale, such as a real estate agent’s commission. Legal fees on the resale are not recoverable, as they are included in taxed costs. See “...the rules of law which are to prevail in relation to remedies...” in *Judicature Act*, s. 46(b).
21. The phrase “relating to the claim” in paragraph 3.3(b), formerly 3.3(a), is replaced with “that are claimed and that were incurred before the effective date”.

22. The second, third, and fourth sentences in paragraph 3.5(a) are removed, the punctuation and letters “: (a)”, “(b)”, and “(c)” in the text of 3.5(a) are removed, and the phrase “before the effective date” is added after “preserving and protecting the property” and before the semi-colon.
23. Paragraph 3.7 is removed and paragraphs 3.8 and 3.9 are renumbered 3.7 and 3.8.
24. The following paragraph V is added to the Practice Memorandum:

V. Simple Foreclosure

- 5.1 For centuries, the practice was to sue for foreclosure or sale. See, for example, *The Nova Scotia Judicature Act, 1884*, R.S.N.S. 1884, c. 104, Order LI, r. 10 and r. 11 “a suit for foreclosure or sale” and Form No. 5 “sale, or foreclosure”. The alternative remedy “sale” eventually became “foreclosure and sale”, with the claim becoming “foreclosure or foreclosure and sale”. See, Cowan, C.J. 1978, “Foreclosures”, “Originating Notice (Action) and Statement of Claim” and *Practice Memorandum No. 13, Foreclosure Proceedings and Forms*, 1994. Although mortgagees sued for alternative remedies, the practice was to move for foreclosure and sale, not simple foreclosure.
- 5.2 Rule 72.15 of the *Nova Scotia Civil Procedure Rules, 2008* recognized “simple foreclosure” as an alternative remedy. Recently, mortgagees have chosen that route although it extinguishes the mortgage debt when the mortgagee can no longer accommodate redemption, such as when the mortgagee sells the foreclosed property to an arms-length third person.
- 5.3 It seems that simple foreclosure is more attractive when the mortgagor is no longer liable on the promise of payment, such as in bankruptcy, or when the very circumstances that caused the default make the cost of obtaining a deficiency judgment wasteful, such as the mortgagor losing employment.
- 5.4 Rule 72 – Mortgages now provides specific direction on motions for simple foreclosure. This evolved from discussions in chambers between chambers judges and counsel who moved for simple foreclosure.
- 5.5 The remedy requires two steps. First, when granting an initial foreclosure order the court sets a deadline for redemption of a mortgaged property. Second, if the deadline passes and the property is not redeemed, the court

grants a final foreclosure order that recognizes that rights of redemption are extinguished and the mortgagee owns the property outright.

- 5.6 Pattern forms for an initial foreclosure order and a final foreclosure order are attached to this Practice Memorandum. Deviations must be brought to the attention of the chambers judge.
- 5.7 Parties are referred to Rules 72.15, 72.16, and 72.17 for what needs to be proved on motions for simple foreclosure and what should be provided in the orders. Rule 35.12 on subsequent encumbrancers provides for notifying them in the usual way in cases of simple foreclosure. The form of notice has been amended to allow for simple foreclosure.
25. The attached forms “Initial Foreclosure Order” and “Final Foreclosure Order” are added to the Practice Memorandum.

Initial Foreclosure Order

On the motion of the plaintiff, the following is ordered and declared:

1. The mortgage granted by [*the defendant*/name] to [*the plaintiff*/name] dated the day of _____, 20____ and [*registered/recorded*] in _____ on the _____ day of _____, 20____ [*in/under*] [book and page/parcel register] is in default.
2. The defendant, and any other person entitled to redeem the mortgage, may exercise their right of redemption by paying the amount due on the mortgage to the plaintiff before noon on day, the _____ day of _____, 20____.
3. The amount due on the mortgage is settled at \$ _____ plus interest at the rate of _____ % a year from _____, 20____ until the date of redemption calculated [*months/semi-annually/not in advance/other*], plus any further protective disbursements or charges approved by the court, plus costs of \$ _____.
4. The right of the defendant, or any person claiming under the defendant, to redeem the mortgaged property is extinguished, unless a right of redemption is exercised before the deadline or a judge orders otherwise.

The plaintiff may make a motion, in anticipation that the right of redemption will expire, for a final foreclosure order declaring that all the right, title, interest, property, and demand of the defendant of, in, or to the mortgaged property, and of any person claiming by, through, or under the defendant, is forever barred and foreclosed.
6. The motion for a final foreclosure order must be made on _____ day, the _____ day of _____, 20____ at _____ o'clock in the [*morning/afternoon*] at the [*Law Courts/Courthouse*] in _____, unless a judge directs otherwise.
7. At least fifteen days before the day appointed by this order for the hearing of the motion for a final foreclosure order, the plaintiff shall deliver to Canada Post a notice of motion for delivery by ordinary mail to the last known address of the defendant and a notice of motion and a

notice to subsequent encumbrancer for delivery by registered mail to each subsequent encumbrancer.

8. The paragraph in the notice of motion titled “Evidence” may read:

Unless a judge directs otherwise, the evidence in support of the motion will be an affidavit of counsel filed two days before the hearing proving delivery, as required, to Canada Post of the notice of motion and notice to subsequent encumbrancer and proving that the mortgaged property has not been redeemed.

9. A subsequent encumbrancer is bound by the terms of this order when the notice of motion and notice to subsequent encumbrancer are delivered to Canada Post for transmission to the subsequent encumbrancer.

10. Notwithstanding this order, a subsequent encumbrancer may defend or contest the claim by filing a notice of defence or notice of contest before the deadline for redemption, or such other time as a judge allows.

11. In the event a notice of defence or notice of contest is filed, the plaintiff and the defending or contesting parties must appear at the time and place set for the motion for a final foreclosure order, and the judge may give directions for conduct of the proceeding.

12. In either of the following circumstances, the plaintiff must, as soon as is practicable, take all steps necessary to cause the public record, including the [parcel register/other] , to show that liability on the mortgage debt is extinguished:

- (a) a person redeems the mortgaged property;
- (b) the plaintiff, or an assignee holding the foreclosed property for the plaintiff, ceases to be able to accommodate redemption, such as the property having been sold to an arms-length third person.
