The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture dated May 14, 2015, and pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 113 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Crop and Livestock Insurance Act*, is pleased to approve amendments made by the Nova Scotia Crop and Livestock Insurance Commission to the *Crop Insurance Plan for Tree Fruit*, N.S. Reg. 121/2003, made by the Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-268 dated June 20, 2003, to clarify provisions respecting coverage for apples in storage in the manner set forth in Schedule “A”, attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after June 9, 2015.

**Schedule “A”****Nova Scotia Crop and Livestock Insurance Commission**

I certify that the Nova Scotia Crop and Livestock Insurance Commission, pursuant to Section 6 of Chapter 113 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Crop and Livestock Insurance Act*, at a meeting held December 10, 2014, passed a motion to amend the *Crop Insurance Plan for Tree Fruit*, N.S. Reg. 121/2003, approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-268 dated June 20, 2003, in the manner set out in the attached.

made by the Nova Scotia Crop and Livestock Insurance Commission  
under Section 6 of Chapter 113 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,  
the *Crop and Livestock Insurance Act***

1 Subsection 23(2) of the *Crop Insurance Plan for Tree Fruit*, N.S. Reg. 121/2003, approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2003-268 dated June 20, 2003, is repealed.

2 (1) Subsection 26(2) of the plan is repealed and the following subsection substituted:

(2) Before an insured person is eligible to make a claim for apple storage loss, the storage losses must affect at least

- (a) 10% of all apples in storage; or
  - (b) 60% of all apples of a specific variety in storage.
- (2) Subsection 26(3) of the plan is repealed.
  - (3) Subsection 26(4) of the plan is amended by striking out “or (3)” immediately after “subsection (2)”.
  - (4) Subsection 26(5) of the plan is repealed and the following subsection substituted:
    - (5) No indemnity shall be paid for loss in storage unless an insured person establishes to the satisfaction of the Commission that the loss
      - (a) resulted directly from one or more designated perils; and
      - (b) was not caused by management of the storage facility.
