Amendment to regulations made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation and approved by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 15 of the *Liquor Control Act* 

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister responsible for the *Liquor Control Act* dated December 20, 2016, and pursuant to Section 15 [of Chapter 260] of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Liquor Control Act*, is pleased to approve of amendments made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation to the *Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 22/1991, made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 91-214 dated February 12, 1991, to clarify the retail sales markup allocation on beverage alcohol products produced in Nova Scotia and sold directly by manufactures, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after January 3, 2017.

Amendment to the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation Regulations made [by the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation] under [Section 15 of] Chapter 260 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the Liquor Control Act

I certify that the Board of Directors of the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation under Section 15 of Chapter 260 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Liquor Control Act*, by resolution dated December 19, 2016, amended the *Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 22/1991 made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 91-214 dated February 12, 1991, to clarify the prescribed prices for the sale of liquor under subsection 42(1) of the Act the manner set forth in the attached, effective on and after the date the amendments are approved by the Governor in Council.

# Amendment to the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation Regulations made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation under Section 15 of Chapter 260 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the Liquor Control Act

Section 13 of the *Nova Scotia Liquor Corporation Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 22/1991, made by the Nova Scotia Liquor Commission and approved by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 91-214 dated February 12, 1991, are amended by repealing subsection (6) and substituting the following subsections:

- (6) The prescribed prices for liquor under subsection 42(1) of the Act include prices determined by the Corporation in respect of all of the following:
  - (a) liquor sold at retail from Government stores and agency stores;
  - (b) liquor sold in the Province from other than Government stores or agency stores, including liquor sold directly by the producer of the liquor under a valid license or permit.
- (7) The prescribed prices for liquor under subsection 42(1) of the Act are as follows:
  - (a) for liquor sold at retail from Government stores and agency stores, the prices set out in an official price list issued by the Corporation from time to time or as otherwise determined by the Corporation, and no store manager shall charge or receive any other price except on written instruction from the Corporation;
  - (b) for liquor sold in the Province from other than Government stores or agency stores, including liquor sold directly by a producer of liquor under a valid license or permit, the prices determined by the Corporation from time to time and communicated to the producers, and no producer of liquor shall charge or receive any other price except on written instruction from the Corporation.
- (8) The prices in subsection (7) include, regardless of whether expressly stated, a retail mark-up sales allocation or similar charge, as determined by the Corporation.

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board ("Board") considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum product prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

**And whereas** the Board revised the wholesale margin effective January 4, 2013, in its decision, 2012 NSUARB 213, issued on December 12, 2012;

And whereas the Board revised the retail margin and transportation allowance effective October 28, 2016, in its decision, 2016 NSUARB 168, issued on September 26, 2016;

**And whereas** the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended December 28, 2016, are:

Grade 1 Regular gasoline 60.9¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil 59.7¢ per litre

**Now therefore** the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

Gasoline:

Grade 1  $60.9 \, \text{¢}$  per litre Grade 2  $63.9 \, \text{¢}$  per litre Grade 3  $66.9 \, \text{¢}$  per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil  $59.7 \, \text{¢}$  per litre

**And now therefore** the Board has determined, based on historical data regarding price changes and to achieve revenue neutrality, it is appropriate to apply, and the Board so orders, forward averaging corrections of:

Gasoline: plus 1.6¢ per litre Ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil: plus 1.2¢ per litre

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 5.1¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

**And now therefore** the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., December 30, 2016.

And whereas a winter blending adjustment of plus 4.9¢ per litre is required for ultra-low-sulfur diesel oil;

**And now therefore** the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule "A" effective on and after 12:01 a.m., January 6, 2017.
