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In force date of regulations: As of November 28, 2023*, the date a regulation comes into force is determined by subsection 3(6) of the *Regulations Act*.

A regulation comes into force on the date it is filed unless the regulation states that it comes into force on a later date, or the Act that the regulation is made under authorizes the regulation to come into force on a date earlier than the date it was filed or authorizes another method of coming into force.

Whereas in and by Section 22 of Chapter 19 of the Acts of 2023, *An Act to Amend Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes, 1989, the Health Services and Insurance Act*, it is enacted as follows:

22 This Act comes into force on such day as the Governor in Council orders and declares by proclamation.

And Whereas it is deemed expedient that Chapter 19 of the Acts of 2023, *An Act to Amend Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes, 1989, the Health Services and Insurance Act*, do come into force on and not before April 9, 2024, with the exception of subsection 11(1) and clause 11(2)(b);

Now Know Ye That We, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Nova Scotia, do by this Our Proclamation order and declare that Chapter 19 of the Acts of 2023, *An Act to Amend Chapter 197 of the Revised Statutes, 1989, the Health Services and Insurance Act*, with the exception of subsection 11(1) and clause 11(2)(b), do come into force on and not before April 9, 2024, of which all persons concerned are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
