- 1 Section 2 of the *Permit for Variance Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 80/2001, made by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries dated June 25, 2001, is amended by adding “*Agricultural*” immediately before “*Marshland Conservation Act*” in clause (a).
- 2 (1) Section 3 of the regulations is redesignated as subsection 3(1).
 - (2) Clause 3(1)(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “that” and substituting “whether”.
 - (3) Clause 3(1)(b) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) adding “except as provided in subsection 3(2),” immediately before “where there is a marsh body incorporated”; and
 - (b) striking out “that” and substituting “whether”.

- (4) Section 3 of the regulations is further amended by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection (1):
- (2) An applicant who is unable to obtain the letter from the marsh body as required by clause (1)(b) must, to the satisfaction of the Marshland Administrator, include all of the following with their application:
- (a) a detailed summary of the efforts they have made to contact the marsh body; and
 - (b) proof of notice of the proposed development they provided to the known members of the marsh body.

Order in Council 2015-239 dated July 23, 2015
amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council
pursuant to subsection 113(1) of the *Wildlife Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Natural Resources dated July 13, 2015, and pursuant to subsection 113(1) of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Wildlife Act*, is pleased, effective on and after July 23, 2015, to

- (a) amend the *General Wildlife Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 205/87, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-1181 dated September 29, 1987, to allow for Sunday hunting on two prescribed Sundays, create special human wildlife conflict stamps and require the submission of biological material, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (b) amend the *Firearm and Bow Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 144/89, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 89-837 dated July 18, 1989, to clarify setbacks for discharging weapons around woods operations and agricultural buildings, in the manner set forth in Schedule “B” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (c) amend the *Fur Harvesting Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 165/87, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-956 dated August 18, 1987, to make changes that will achieve consistency with the *General Wildlife Regulations*, in the manner set forth in Schedule “C” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;
- (d) amend the *Deer Hunting Regulations*, NS. Reg. 239/2013, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2013-216 dated June 25, 2013, to make changes that will achieve consistency with

the *General Wildlife Regulations*, in the manner set forth in Schedule “D” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation;

- (e) amend the *Bear Harvesting Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 60/88, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 88-349 dated March 29, 1988, to make changes that will achieve consistency with the *General Wildlife Regulations*, in the manner set forth in Schedule “E” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation; and
- (f) amend the *Pheasant Shooting Preserve Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 89/88, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 88-404 dated April 20, 1988, to make changes that will achieve consistency with the *General Wildlife Regulations*, in the manner set forth in Schedule “F” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation.

General Wildlife Regulations—amendment

Schedule “A”

**Amendment to the *General Wildlife Regulations*
made by the Governor in Council under subsection 113(1)
of Chapter 504 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Wildlife Act***

- 1 Subsection 2(1) of the *General Wildlife Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 205/87, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 87-1181 dated September 29, 1987, is amended by adding the following clause immediately after clause (c):
 - (ca) “human wildlife conflict stamp” means a stamp issued by the Department in accordance with Section 5B to allow the hunting of nuisance deer or bear;
- 2 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 5A:

Human wildlife conflict stamp

5B (1) The Department may issue a human wildlife conflict stamp to any of the following who meet the licensing and certification requirements of subsection (2):

- (a) a farmer who demonstrates that deer or bear are causing crop or other damage with significant economic loss to the farmer;
 - (b) a person who is acting as an agent of a farmer referred to in clause (a);
 - (c) an individual who has the consent of a farmer referred to in clause (a) to take nuisance deer or bear on the farmer’s property.
- (2)** To be eligible for a human wildlife conflict stamp, a person must
- (a) hold a valid base licence; and
 - (b) be certified to hunt with a weapon authorized for hunting deer and bear.
- (3)** An application for a human wildlife conflict stamp shall be on a form prescribed by the Department and, except as provided in subsection (4), shall be accompanied by a fee of \$5.57.

- (4) There is no fee for a human wildlife conflict stamp issued to a farmer referred to in clause (1)(a) or a farmer's agent referred to in clause (1)(b).
- (5) A person may apply for and hold more than 1 human wildlife conflict stamp in the same year.
- (6) A human wildlife conflict stamp allows the person to whom it is issued to take, hunt or kill 1 deer or 1 bear.
- (7) A human wildlife conflict stamp is subject to terms and condition of use determined by the Department, which shall include all of the following:
 - (a) a description of the location for which the human wildlife conflict stamp is valid, which may include references to property boundaries or geographic features such as roads and rivers;
 - (b) a statement of the period of time during which the human wildlife conflict stamp is valid.
- (8) A human wildlife conflict stamp shall be in the form prescribed by the Department and shall be accompanied by the terms and conditions of use that apply to it.
- (8)* Failure of a person to comply with the terms and conditions of a human wildlife conflict stamp may result in refusal of any subsequent applications from that person for human wildlife conflict stamps.
- (9)* The holder of a human wildlife conflict stamp shall dispose of any deer or bear harvested as directed by the Department.

4* The regulations are further amended by adding the following section immediately after section 15A:

Species designated for mandatory submission of biological material

15B Any person who lawfully takes or kills an animal of a species designated by the Minister for the mandatory submission of biological material shall submit any biological material required by the Minister.

3* The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 10:

Sunday hunting

11 For the purpose of the exception allowed by subsection 71(1) of the Act, hunting is lawful on the 1st and 2nd Sundays following the last Friday in October for all species of wildlife that are allowed to be hunted under the Act and its regulations, except moose.

- 1 Section 2 of the *Firearm and Bow Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 144/89, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 89-837 dated July 18, 1989, is amended by
 - (a) striking out the period at the end of clause (k) and substituting a semicolon; and
 - (b) adding the following clause immediately after clause (k):
 - (l) “woods operation” means any of the following sites when workers are present on the site:
 - (i) a tree plantation,
 - (ii) a Christmas tree management area,
 - (iii) a special forestry study area,
 - (iv) an area where activity is taking place on woodlands for the purpose of harvesting forest products or for silviculture.
- 2 Subsection 11(2) of the regulations is amended by adding “, agricultural building” immediately after “place of business”.
- 3 Subsection 11(3) of the regulations is amended by adding “, agricultural building” immediately after “place of business”.
- 4 Subsection 11(4) of the regulations is amended by adding “, agricultural building” immediately after “place of business”.
- 5 Clause 11(5)(b) of the regulations is amended by striking out “or place of business” and substituting “, place of business or agricultural building.”

Section 9 of the *Milk Pricing Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 84/2008, made by the Dairy Farmers of Nova Scotia on September 21, 2007, and approved by the Natural Products Marketing Council on February 12, 2008, is repealed and the following Section substituted:

Producer fees

9 (1) Each producer must pay the following fees to the Board:

- (a) an administration fee of \$0.16 per kilogram of butterfat marketed,
- (b) a milk promotion fee of \$0.3947 per kilogram of butterfat marketed,
- (c) a school milk fee in an amount per kilogram of butterfat marketed, calculated using the following formula so that the total of the school milk fees collected from all producers in a month is sufficient to pay the Board's costs in the previous month for the School Milk Program administered by the Department of Agriculture:

$$\text{SMF} = (\text{TL} \times .15) \div \text{TK}$$

in which

SMF is the school milk fee per kilogram of butterfat marketed,

TL is the total litres of milk sold under the School Milk Program in the previous month, and

TK is the total number of kilograms of butterfat marketed by all producers in the previous month;

- (d) a milk testing fee, calculated using the following formula so that the amount of the milk testing fee is the same for every producer, and the total of the milk testing fees collected in a month from all producers is sufficient to pay the Board's costs for milk component and quality testing in the previous month:

$$\text{MTF} = \text{TT} \div \text{TP}$$

in which

MTF is the milk testing fee,

TT is the total testing costs of the Board in the previous month, and

TP is the total number of producers.

- (2) Fees paid by producers under subsection (1) must be deducted by the Board from the producer's payment or, if payment is made by a payment agent, must be deducted by the payment agent and remitted to the Board no later than the date indicated on the monthly reporting schedule prepared by the board in consultation and agreement with processors.
