NOTICE OF PROPOSED DEREGISTRATION OF A PROPERTY AS A PROVINCIAL HERITAGE PROPERTY

You are hereby notified that:

1. The land and building located at Granville Centre, in the County of Annapolis, Province of Nova Scotia, commonly referred to as the "Troop Barn;" being further described in conveyance dated May 19, 1984; between Some Fine Investments Limited of the One Part and Mark. E. Ertolahti of the Other Part and registered in the Registry of Deeds for Annapolis in Book 350, page 463; also being referred to in a Caveat dated June 9, 1983 and registered in the Registry of Deeds for Annapolis in Book 351 at pages 96-97 and currently owned by Richard James Harries.

2. The reasons for this proposed deregistration are: the structure's state of deterioration.

3. The effect of deregistration from the Provincial Registry of Heritage Property means that the lands and buildings described herein will cease to be a Provincial Heritage Property and the owner may alter or demolish said property without reference, under the Heritage Property Act, to the Governor-in-Council.

4. A decision with respect to deregistration of the property herein described from the Provincial Registry of Heritage Property will not take place until 30 days after service of this Notice in order to allow adequate time for interested persons to make representation to the Minister with respect to the proposed deregistration. You are invited to forward to me at 1747 Summer Street, Halifax, Nova Scotia, B3H 3A6, any comments you might wish to make on this matter during the 30 day period.
