Under the general supervision of the Construction Manager, the Project Engineer manages all phases of contract work for bridge and highway construction and rehabilitation, ensuring that the contractor performs all aspects of a contract to Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal plans and specifications. S/he is responsible for cost estimates, Occupational Health and Safety, environmental concerns and contract administration. S/he supervises survey and technical staff, recommends construction improvements based on assessment of field conditions and contributes to the design of highways and structures. Work hours are 8:00am to 4:30pm with compensation for overtime. Project Engineers must provide their own vehicles and are compensated with a monthly vehicle allowance of \$847.05. Project engineers start at four weeks vacation per year.

Bachelor's Degree in Engineering required (Civil, Geomatics/Geotechnical preferred). The positions demand individuals who can communicate effectively in dealing with the public, staff and various officials. Candidates must be registered members of the Association of Professional Engineers in Nova Scotia (or be eligible). Candidates must be able to manage multiple priorities, supervise people, have excellent organizational skills and demonstrate sound decision making skills. In addition s/he will have effective verbal and written communication skills. Experience in and knowledge of highway and bridge construction is an asset.
