Trunked Mobile Radio System (TMRS) Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia Initiative

Residents of Upper Musquodoboit and Chaplin, HRM and Upper Cornwall, Lunenburg County

The Province of Nova Scotia is currently working to improve the quality of its Trunked Mobile Radio System (TMRS), which is a telecommunications system built to support all day-to-day field communications for provincial government departments, their agencies, the RCMP, and several federal government departments and agencies. In addition, the province is also working to ensure that high-speed access to the Internet is available to all Nova Scotians.

To achieve both these objectives, the Nova Scotia provincial government plans to erect new structures at sites at the following locations. The structure will be used for both the TMRS and the Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia initiative:

Watson Hill Road, Upper Musquodoboit, Lot 08-1, Halifax Regional Municipality. Nova Scotia provincial government is proposing to construct a 79m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located off Watson Hill Rd., approximately 2.5km from its intersection with Highway 224, Latitude 45° 08' 40.0" Longitude 62° 58' 53".

St Mary's Road, Chaplin, Lot 08-1, Halifax Regional Municipality. Nova Scotia provincial government is proposing to construct a 83m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located approximately 3 kms east of Chaplin off St. Mary's Road, Latitude 45°12' 41.07" Longitude 62°49' 53".

Natural Forest Lake Road, Upper Cornwall, Lot 04-3, Lunenburg County. Nova Scotia provincial government is proposing to construct a 59m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located off Natural Forest Lake Rd., approximately one kilometre northeast of Cornwall Rd., Latitude 44° 32' 40.0" Longitude 65° 36' 53".
