Trunked Mobile Radio System (TMRS) Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia Initiative

*Residents of Southampton, Cumberland County and
New Tusket, Digby County*

The Province of Nova Scotia is currently working to improve the quality of its Trunked Mobile Radio System (TMRS), which is a telecommunications system built to support all day-to-day field communications for provincial government departments, their agencies, the RCMP, and several federal government departments and agencies. In addition, the province is also working to ensure that high speed access to the Internet is available to all Nova Scotians.

To achieve both these objectives, the Nova Scotia provincial government plans to erect new structures at sites at the following locations. The structure will be used for the TMRS and the Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia initiative:

No. 526 Highway, Southampton, Cumberland County. Nova Scotia provincial government is proposing to construct a 61m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located off Southbrook Rd., Latitude 45° 31' 55" Longitude 64° 10' 98".

Green Rd, New Tusket, Lot A, Digby County. Nova Scotia provincial government is proposing to construct a 66m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located one kilometre east of Highway 340, Latitude 44° 16' 01" Longitude 65° 54' 08".
