## Trunk Mobile Radio System (TMRS) Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia Initiative

### *Residents of Hannamville, Annapolis County*

The Province of Nova Scotia is currently working to improve the quality of its Trunked Mobile Radio System (TMRS), which is a telecommunications system built to support all day-to-day field communications for provincial government departments, their agencies, the RCMP, and several federal government departments and agencies. In addition, the Province is also working to ensure that high-speed access to the Internet is available to all Nova Scotians.

To achieve both these objectives, the Nova Scotia Provincial Government plans to erect a new structure at the following location. The structure will be used for the TMRS and the Broadband for Rural Nova Scotia initiative:

**West Dalhousie Rd., Hannamville, Annapolis County.** Nova Scotia Provincial Government is proposing to construct a 66m guyed tower complete with a 12' X 24' equipment shelter. The tower will be equipped with a locked anti-climb attachment. The proposed tower site is located off West Dalhousie Rd., 4.8km east of Morse Rd., and 1.8km west of Gillis Rd., near Hannamville, Annapolis County. Latitude 44°42'43" Longitude 65°10'08"
