

# RESPIRATORY WATCH

Week 15 (April 5 to April 11, 2020)

## In Summary...

### Activity levels\*\*

• Central Zone is reporting sporadic activity. No activity reported in Eastern, Northern and Western Zones.

#### Laboratory-confirmed cases\*

- There have been 0 influenza A and 1 influenza B case reported during this report week. There have been 186 laboratory confirmed cases of Influenza A and 243 laboratory confirmed cases of Influenza B reported during the 2019-2020 influenza season.
- Positive results were received for Adenovirus, Pertussis and RSV.

#### Severity

- There have been 14 ICU admissions in adults and 4 ICU admissions in children (age group 0-19 years).
- There have been 6 deaths\*\*\* of laboratory confirmed influenza during the 2019-2020 influenza season in adults. There have been 0 deaths\*\*\* of laboratory confirmed influenza in children (age group 0-19 years).


#### Syndromic surveillance

The ILI rate for Nova Scotia for the current week is 1.2.

Notes: \*Reporting weeks run from Sunday to Saturday. The 2019-2020 influenza season is defined using PHAC's influenza surveillance weeks. This year runs from August 25, 2019 (Week 35) to August 22, 2020 (Week 34);





#### **ILI CASE DEFINITION**

Acute onset of respiratory illness with fever and cough and with one or more of the following – sore throat, arthralgia, myalgia or prostration which is likely due to influenza. In children under 5, gastrointestinal symptoms may also be present. In patients under 5 or 65 and older, fever may not be prominent.
