

## Selection Criteria

	<b>Agency, Board or Commission</b>	POLICE ADVISORY BOARDS
1	<b>Statute</b>	S. 57 of Chapter 31 of the Acts of 2004 proclaimed in force January 1, 2006.
2	<b>Purpose &amp; Function</b>	The function of an advisory board is to provide advice to Municipal Council in relation to the enforcement of law, maintenance of law and order, and the prevention of crime in the municipality.
3	<b>Composition</b>	Advisory Boards consists of five or seven members. A five member board consists of two members of council, appointed by council, two members who are not councillors or employees of the municipality and one member appointed by the Minister. A seven member board consists of three members of council appointed by council, three members who are not councillors or employees of the municipality and one member appointed by the Minister.
4	<b>Formal Qualifications</b>	none
5	<b>Work &amp; Experience Requirements</b>	residence in the municipality served by the board, or considerable interest in serving on the advisory board; of a good character; willingness to make a commitment of time and effort to carry out advisory board responsibilities.
6	<b>Skills Required</b>	considerable knowledge of community issues and an understanding of policing values and governance;
7	<b>Statutory Nomination</b>	N/A
8	<b>Traditional Nomination Requirements</b>	N/A
9	<b>Remuneration</b>	Currently there is no remuneration by Government
10	<b>Anticipated Time Commitments</b>	one meeting at least every three months

11	<b>Other Notes</b>	Prior to being appointed to serving on an Advisory Board, applicants must consent to a criminal records check and take an Oath of Office or affirmation.
