

## Board Selection Criteria

Agency, Board or Commission		Board of the College of Respiratory Therapists
1	<b>Statute</b>	C.13 of the Acts of 2007, The Respiratory Therapists Act
2	<b>Purpose</b>	<p><b>Non-Adjudicative Board</b></p> <p>The Board shall govern the College of Respiratory Therapists and manage its affairs, the Board may take any action consistent with the “<i>The Respiratory Therapists Act</i>” and the regulations that it considers necessary for the promotion, protection, interest or welfare of the College.</p>
3	<b>Functions</b>	To serve and protect the public interest; preserve the integrity of the profession and maintain public confidence in the ability of the profession to regulate itself by establishing, developing and promoting standards of practice, a code of ethics and approve continuing education credits for its members.
4	<b>Composition</b>	<p>The Board consists of:</p> <p>(a) the President, the President Elect, the Past President and the Treasurer each whom must hold a license to practice Respiratory Therapy</p> <p>(b) Three (3) members, each whom holds a license to practice Respiratory Therapy</p> <p>(c) no fewer than two (2) and no more than three (3) Public Representatives appointed by the Governor in Council who are not members of the College and have shown interest in serving on the Board.</p>
5	<b>Formal Qualifications</b>	For those other than the Public members a license to practice respi respiratory therapy is required.
6	<b>Work &amp; Experience Requirements</b>	For members nominated by the College must hold a license to practice respiratory therapy. Public representatives are not members of the College and have shown an interest in serving on the Board.
7	<b>Skills Required</b>	Leadership abilities in community, including volunteer activity and interest in health issues and/or willingness to learn as well as willing to accept the responsibility of becoming a board member and the accountability involved. Represent and protect the interests of the general public in matters relating to the practice of respiratory therapy. Ability to work effectively as a member of a team
8	<b>Statutory/Traditional Nomination Requirements</b>	Persons on the Board shall be elected or appointed or succeed to office in the manner prescribed by the by-law. Public representatives apply through the Executive Council Office and are appointed by Governor in Council

<b>9</b>	<b>Term of Appointment</b>	All members serve terms at the pleasure of the Board. Public representatives on the Board continue to hold office until their successors are appointed or until such time as that are re-appointed
<b>10</b>	<b>Remuneration</b>	As determined by the Board.
<b>11</b>	<b>Anticipated Time Commitments</b>	As determined by the Board.
