1	Statute	C. 10 of the Acts of 2001, the Registered Nurses Act
2	Purpose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Regulate the practice of nursing through registration, licensing and professional conduct process; establish and promote standards of professional practice, competency and a code of ethics;</li> <li>- Advance and promote the practice of nursing;</li> <li>- Encourage members to participate in affairs promoting the practice of nursing in the best interests of the public;</li> <li>- Do such other lawful acts and things as are incidental to the attainment of the objects referred to in clauses (a) to (c).</li> </ul>
3	Functions	
4	Composition	<p>The Board consists of such number of persons as determined by the by-laws. Non-registrant representation on the Council, shall be appointed by Governor in Council. Members other than Governor in Council appointees shall be elected or appointed. The Council shall appoint a Registrar, known as the Executive Director.</p> <p>1/3 to 1/2 of membership shall be appointed by Governor in Council (currently 6 Governor in Council appointed members)</p>

7	Skills Required	The Governor in Council appointee must not be a nurse; must be representative of the public.

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	Requirements	
9	Term of Appointment	Determined by by-laws (typically up to 3 years). Persons appointed by the Governor in Council hold office until their successors are appointed or until such time as they are reappointed.
10	Remuneration	Replacement salary up to \$335.00/day + expenses
11	Anticipated Time Commitments	approximately 5 meetings per year (typically full day meetings)
