1	Statute	C. 17 of the Statutes of 1990, the Law Reform Commission Act
2	Purpose	To review the law of the Province and matters relating to law and to make recommendations for improvement, modernization and reform.

4	Composition	<p>Consists of not fewer than 5 nor more than 7, either on a full time or part time basis:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 2 members appointed by the Council of the Nova Scotia Barristers' Society; - judge of a court of the Province appointed by Governor in Council after consultation with the Chief Justice; - 1 full-time member of the Faculty of Law of Dalhousie University appointed by Governor in Council after consultation with the Dean of the Faculty; - 1 member who is a graduate in law appointed by Governor in Council; - 1 - 2 other Governor in Council appointments. <p>President is appointed by the members.</p>
