Provincial Deed Transfer Tax Proof of Residency Form

SECTION 1 - GENERAL INFORMATION & PRIVACY NOTICE

The provincial deed transfer tax (PDTT) applies to residential properties of 3 or fewer dwelling units being transferred to 1 or more grantees where an ownership interest in the property is granted to a non-resident(s) of Nova Scotia (NS), unless an exemption exists. Individuals that move to NS within 6 months of the property transfer may be exempt from the tax after moving to NS and demonstrating proof of NS residency. Proof of residency must be demonstrated by each grantee who moved to NS by completing this form and providing supporting documentation. This must be submitted to the Administrator within 6 months of the date the property was transferred (i.e. the closing date). If not submitted, the tax plus interest becomes payable and a penalty may also be assessed. For more information visit: https://novascotia.ca/NonResidentDeedTransferTax
