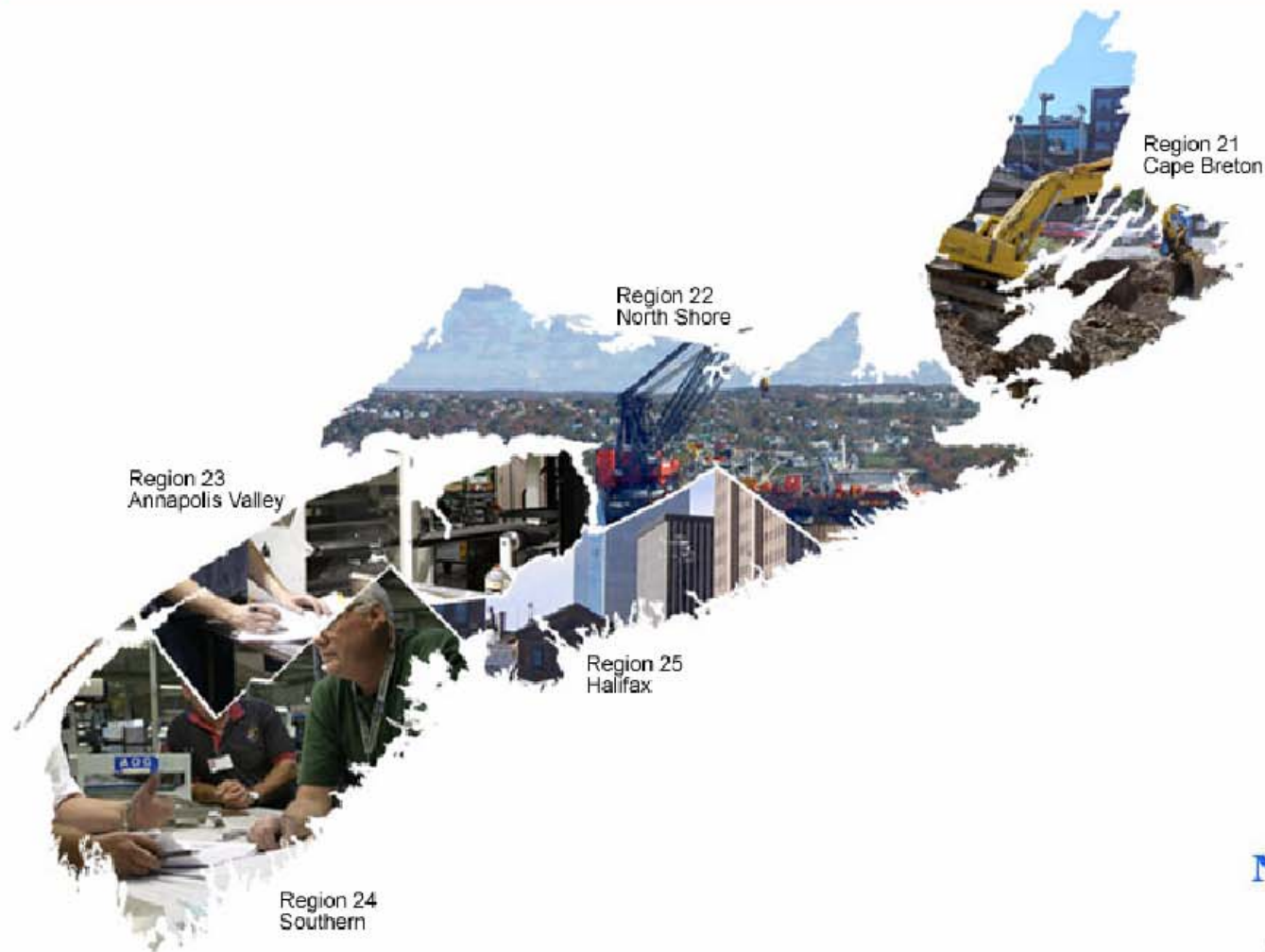

## Introduction

The *Labour Force Data, Historical, 1998 to 2007*, has been compiled using the Labour Force Survey series from Statistics Canada's CANSIM<sup>1</sup> database, and historical labour force data in its annual LFS CD-ROM product—see *2007 Labour Force Historical Review*, Catalogue No. 71F0004XCB<sup>2</sup>. While the Economics & Statistics Division's, *Labour Force Data, Historical* includes key labour force indicators 1998 to 2007, the Statistics Canada CANSIM and CD series of LFS estimates, contains thousands of cross-classified data series, with most of the data spanning 1976 to 2007. In addition to the tables included on the following pages, the Statistics Canada CANSIM and CD products can also be referenced on a much wider range of monthly and annual labour force data (see subject areas below).

### **About the Labour Force Survey (LFS)**

The Labour Force Survey (LFS—Survey No. 3701<sup>3</sup>) is a household survey carried out monthly by Statistics Canada. Begun in 1945, the objectives of the LFS have been to divide the working-age population into three mutually exclusive classifications: 1) employed, 2) unemployed, and 3) not in the labour force; and to provide descriptive and explanatory data on each of these categories. Data from the survey provides information on major labour trends such as shifts in employment across industrial sectors, hours worked, labour force participation and unemployment rates.

The LFS survey uses a sample of individuals who are representative of the civilian, non-institutionalized population 15 years of age or older in Canada's ten provinces. Residents of the Territories, persons living on Indian Reserves, full-time members of the Canadian Armed Forces and residents of institutions are not included in the survey's coverage. There are currently 2,865 Nova Scotia households in the current sample and

53,447 households in total across Canada (unchanged from January 2008).

**Definitions**—the key definitions used in the LFS follow. For a more detailed dictionary of concepts and definitions refer to Statistics Canada, *Guide to the Labour Force Survey*, Catalogue No. 71-543-GIE.

**Population:** The target population covered by the survey corresponds to all persons aged 15 years and over residing in the provinces of Canada, with the exception of the following: 1) persons living on Indian Reserves, 2) full-time members of the regular Armed Forces, and 3) persons living in institutions.

**Labour Force:** The civilian non-institutional population 15 years of age and over that, during the survey reference week, was employed or unemployed and actively looking for work. Prior to 1966, persons aged 14 and over were covered by the survey.

**Employment:** Employed persons are those persons who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit, or had a job and were absent from work.

**Full-time Employment:** Refers to those persons who usually work 30 hours or more per week at their main or only job.

**Part-time Employment:** Refers to those persons who usually work less than 30 hours per week at their main or only job.

**Unemployment:** Unemployed persons are those persons who, during reference week, were available for work and were either on temporary layoff, had looked for

work in the past four weeks, or had a job to start within the next four weeks.

**Not in the Labour Force:** Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the reference week, were unwilling or unable to offer or supply labour services under conditions existing in their labour markets, that is, they were neither employed nor unemployed.

**Unemployment Rate:** The number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, sex, marital status, etc.) is the number unemployed in that group expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

**Participation Rate:** The total labour force expressed as a percentage of the population aged 15 years and over. The participation rate for a particular group (for example, women aged 25 years and over) is the labour force in that group expressed as a percentage of the population for that group.

**Employment Rate:** The number of employed persons expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over. The employment rate for a particular group (age, sex, marital status, province, etc.) is the number employed in that group expressed as a percentage of the population for that group.

## Overview – Nova Scotia Labour Force and Employment in 2007

Employment in Nova Scotia averaged 447,600 in 2007, an increase of 5,800 over 2006 (1.3 per cent) and 52,300 or 13.2 per cent above the 1998 figure. From 1998 to 2007, there has been an 14.9 per cent increase in full-time jobs and a 6.4 per cent gain in part-time positions. During this period, full-time female employment rose 25.2 per cent and part-time employment increased 4.8 per cent, while male full-time and part-time employment increased 7.6 per cent and 10.5 per cent respectively. In 2007, while 88.4 per cent of men employed were full-time and 11.6 per cent part-time, 74.4 per cent of employed women worked full-time and 25.6 per cent worked part-time.

Employment in Canada stood at 16,866,400 in 2007, up 2.3 per cent over the previous year and 20.1 per cent over 1998. From 1998 to 2007, there has been an increase in full-time and part-time positions of 21.0 per cent and 15.9 per cent, respectively. During this period, full-time female employment rose 28.3 per cent and part-time employment increased 13.2 per cent, while male full-time and part-time employment increased 16.1 per cent and 22.1 per cent, respectively. In 2007, while 89.0 per cent of men employed were full-time and 11.0 per cent were part-time workers, 73.9 per cent of employed women worked full-time and 26.1 per cent worked part-time.

In 2007, Nova Scotia's number of unemployed persons increased by 1,000 from the previous year. The annual unemployment rate was 8.0 per cent in 2007, as compared to 7.9 per cent in 2006 and 10.5 per cent in 1998. Canada's unemployment rate in 2007 was 6.0 per cent, down 0.3 percentage points from 2006, and it stood at 8.3 per cent in 1998. From 2006 to 2007, the unemployment rate increased in the provinces of Nova Scotia, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta, each increasing by 0.1 percentage points, while it decreased in all other provinces.

Employment in Nova Scotia's goods-producing sector represented 19.7 per cent of total employment in 2007. Employment in the sector increased 2.9 per cent over the previous year. Within the goods producing sector in 2007, annual increases in employment were noted in agriculture industries, which increased by 900 to 5,600; forestry and logging with support activities, which rose by 300 to 2,500; utilities, which increased by 100 to 1,900; and manufacturing, at 41,400, had increased by 2,300. Employment within mining and oil and gas extraction industries was unchanged. The number employed within fishing, hunting and trapping industries decreased by 900 to 6,300; while employment in construction industries declined by 100 to 27,200.

There was a 0.9 per cent growth in employment in Nova Scotia's service sector during the same period. Employment growth within the service sector industries from 2006 to 2007 was seen in finance and insurance, an increase of 1,300 to 15,500; educational services, an increase of 1,600 to 36,300; health care and social assistance, up 2,400 to 61,500; information, culture and recreation, an increase of 3,200 to 19,500; and accommodation and food services, up 400 to 30,200. Offsetting declines in the service-producing sector were within wholesale trade, a decrease of 300 to 13,500; retail trade, a decline of 1,000 to 63,700; transportation and warehousing, down 300 to 18,400; real estate and leasing, down 400 to 7,700; professional, scientific and technical services, a decrease of 900 to 17,500; business, building and other support services, a

decrease of 1,700 to 27,100; other services, down 400 to 30,200; and public administration a decline of 1,100 to 26,100.

The Halifax<sup>1</sup> unemployment rate in 2007 increased 0.2 percentage points over 2006 to 5.2 per cent and represented a 2.1 percentage point decline over 1998. The Halifax employment rate (ratio of number of persons employed as a percentage of population 15 years of age and over) was 66.5 per cent in 2007, a 0.7 percentage point increase over 2007 and a 3.3 per cent increase over 1998.

The following table indicates the unemployment rate of the regions of Nova Scotia in 2007 and compares the change over 2006.

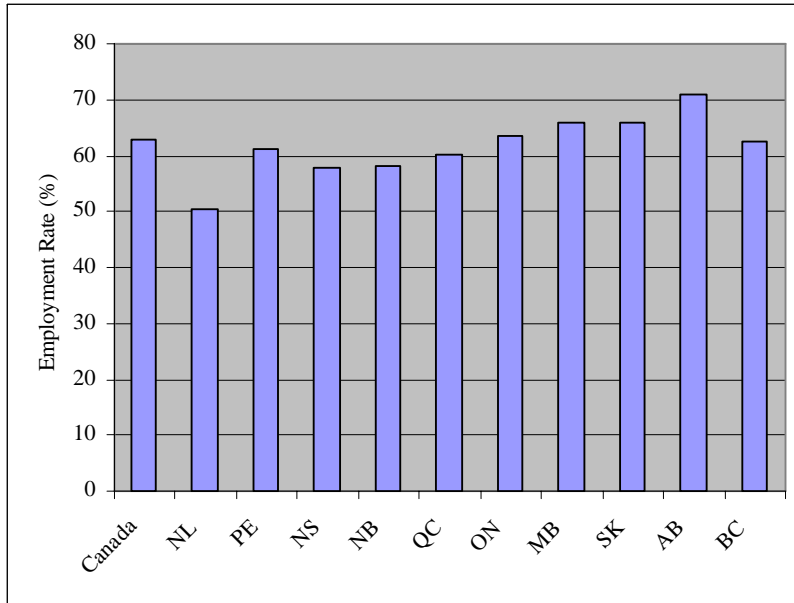

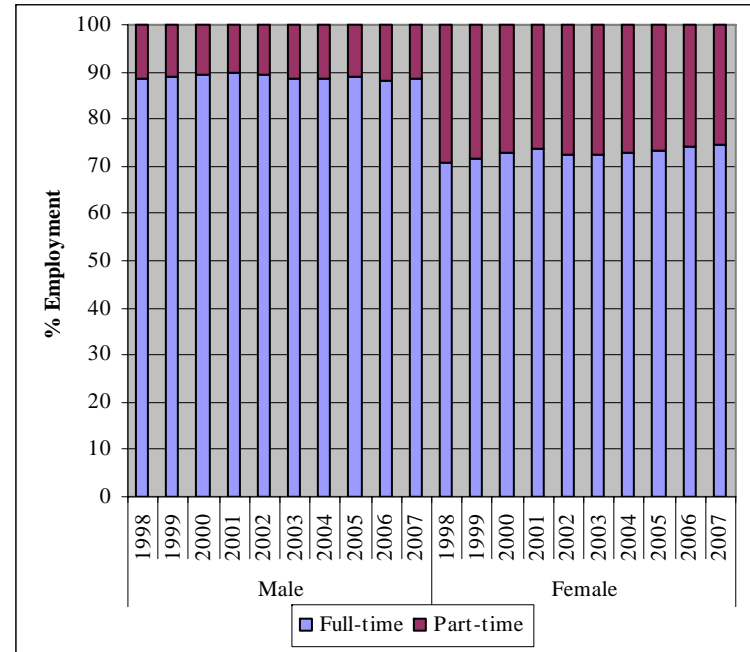
Employment Rate, Canada and the Provinces, 2007

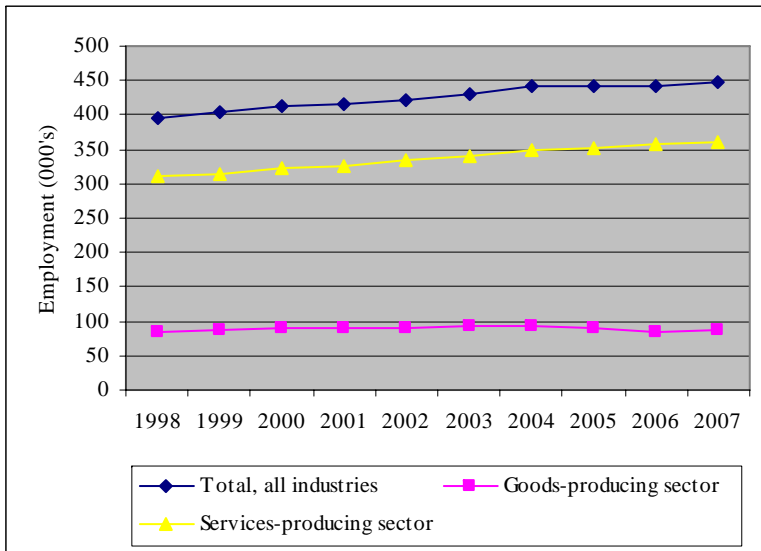
Employment, % Full-time and Part-time, by Sex, Nova Scotia, 1998 to 2007

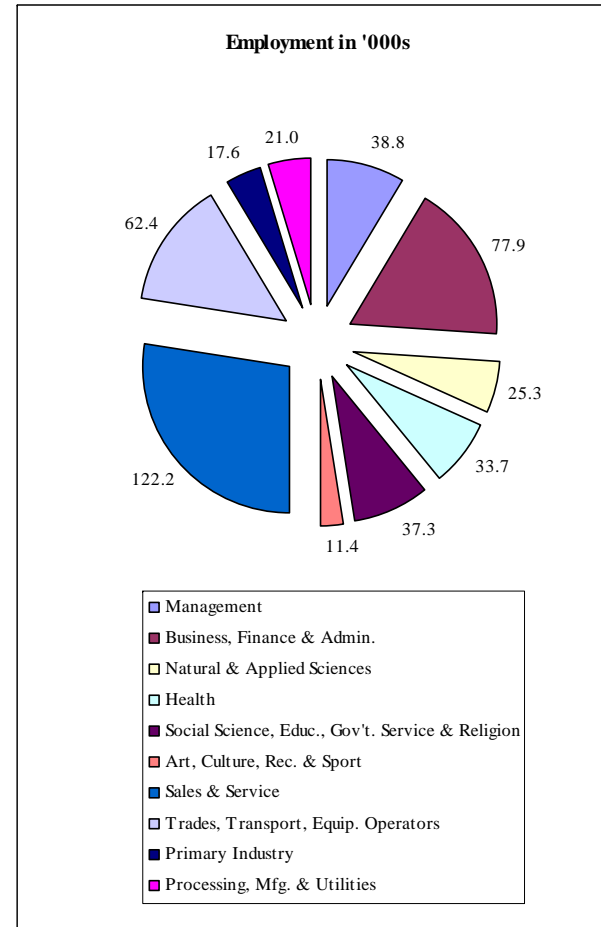
Employment, Goods-Producing and Service-Producing Sectors

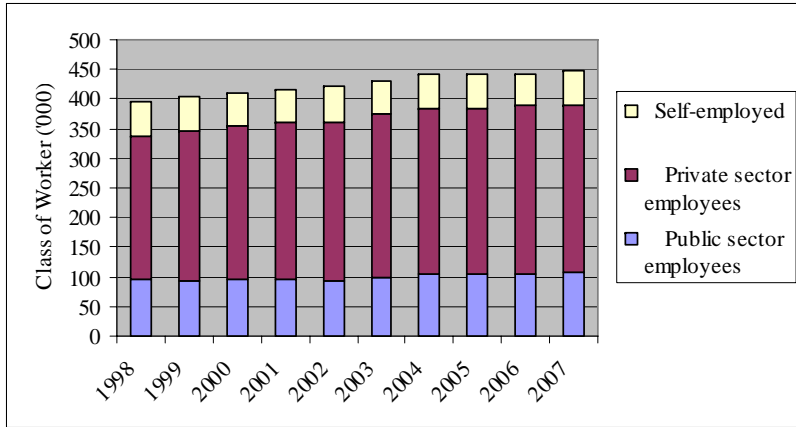
Employment, by Major Occupational Grouping, Nova Scotia, 2007

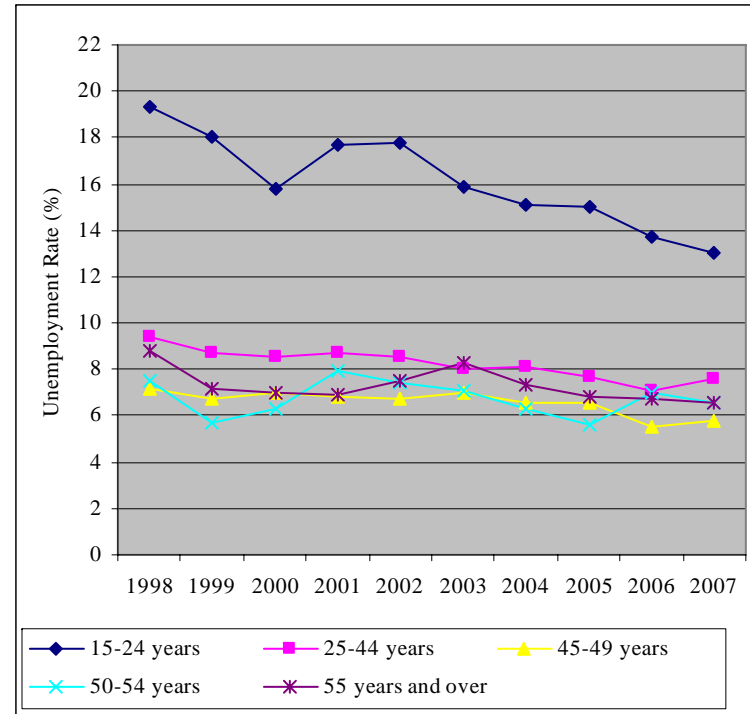
Employed, by Class of Worker, Nova Scotia, 1998 to 2007

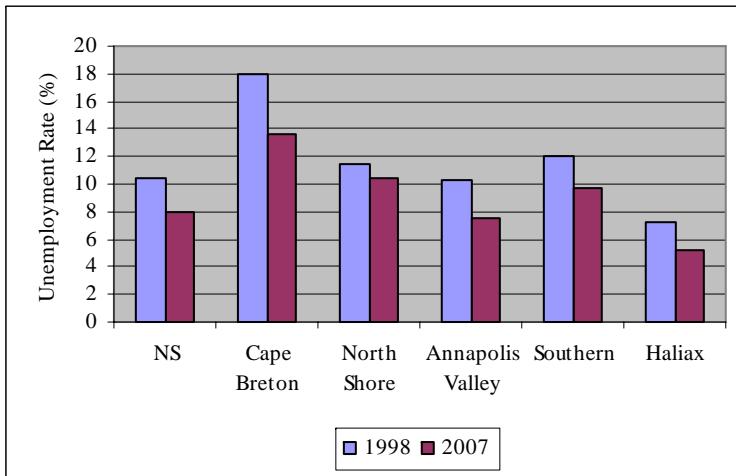
Unemployment Rate (%), by Age Groups, Nova Scotia, 1998 to 2007

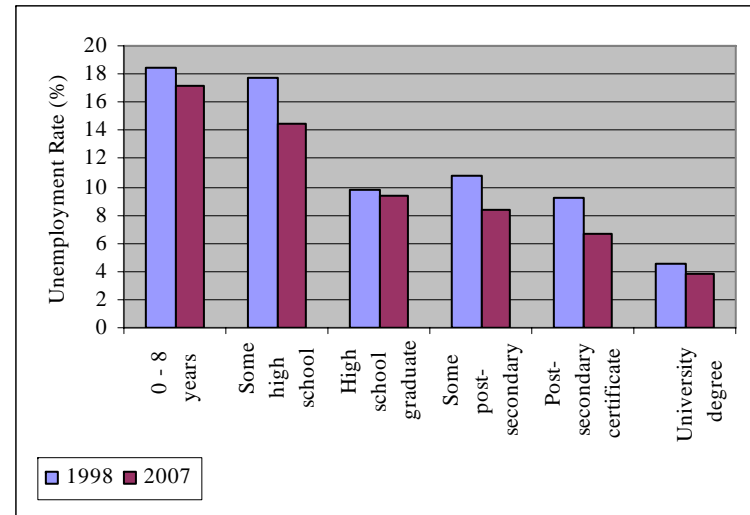
Unemployment Rate, Nova Scotia and

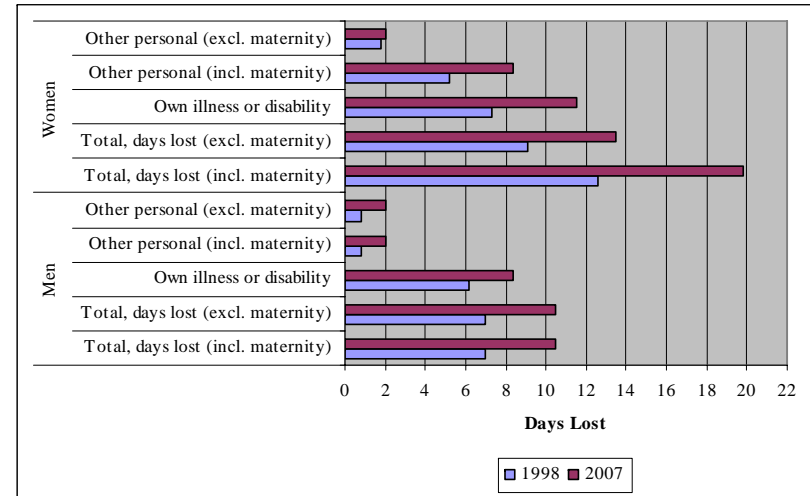
Duration of Unemployment, by Sex, Nova Scotia, 1998 and 2007

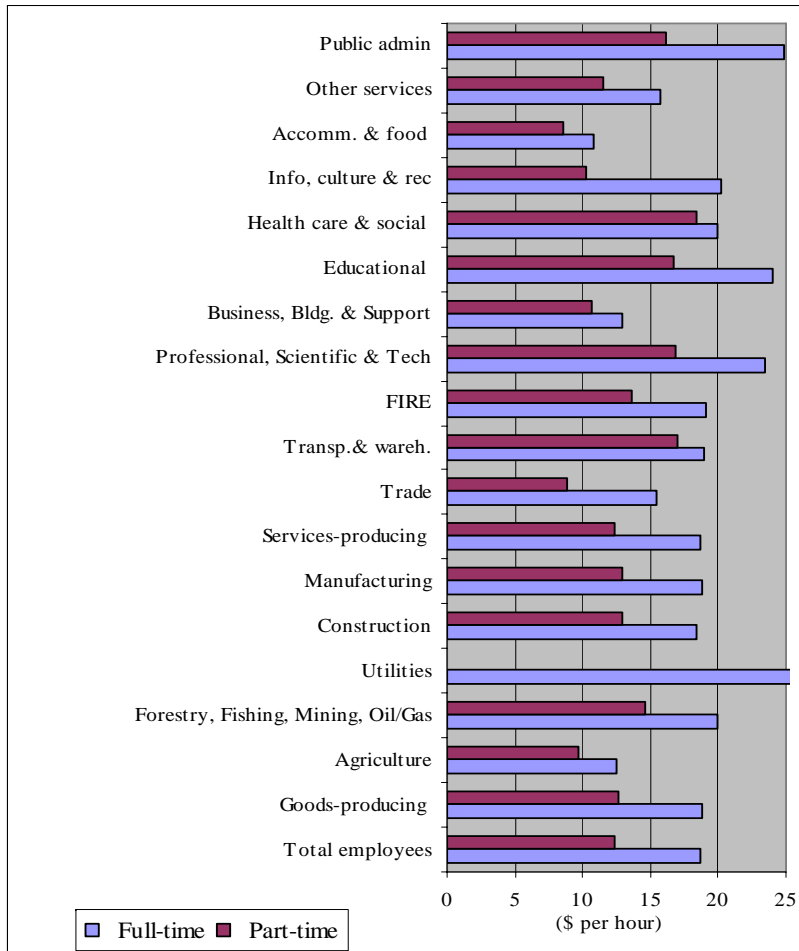
Total Days Lost, by Sex, Nova Scotia, 1998 and 2007

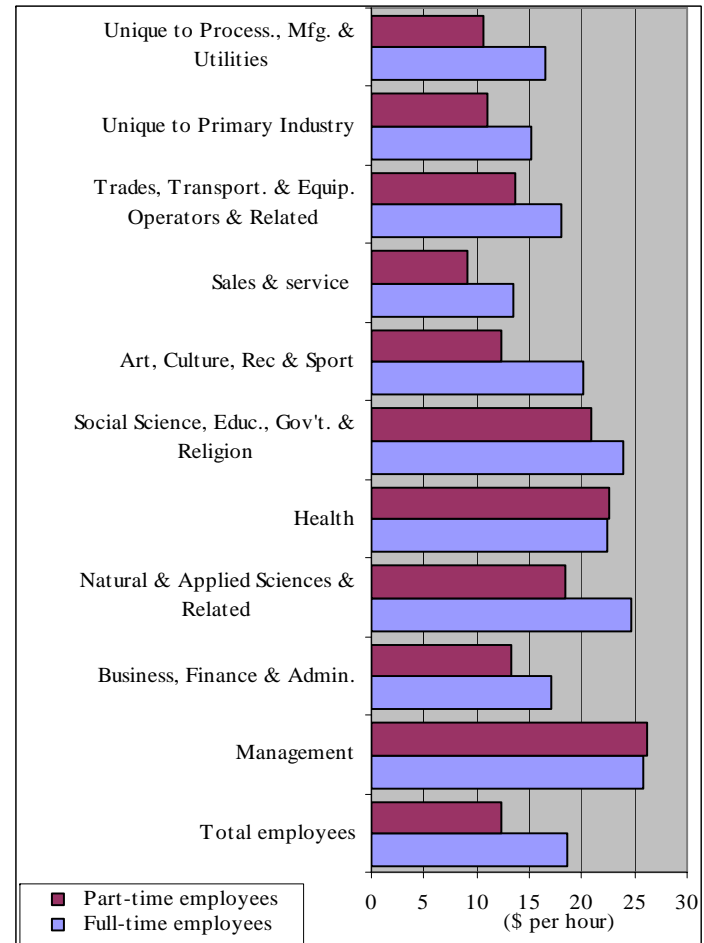
Employees, Average Hourly Wage (\$), Full-time and Part-time, by Major Industry Group, Nova Scotia, 2007

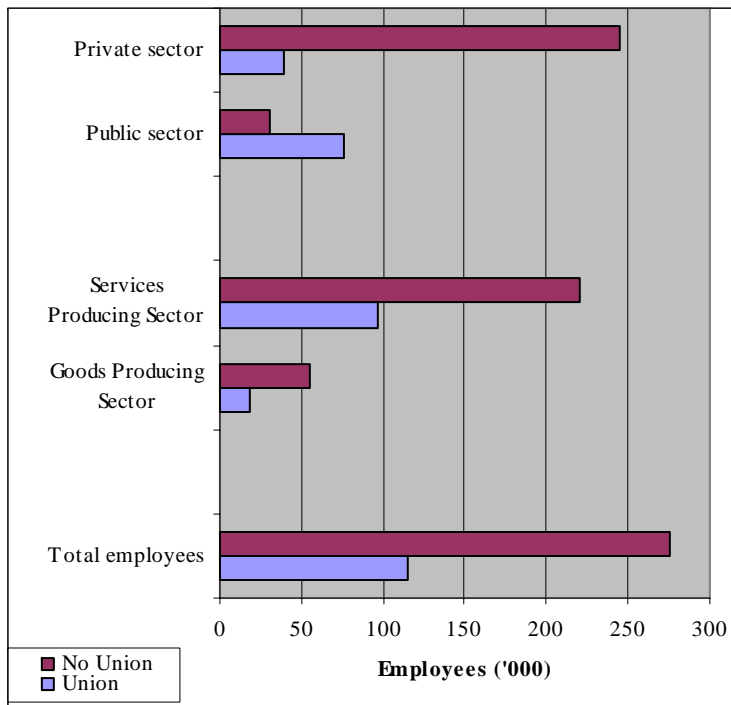
Employees, Average Hourly Wage (\$), Full-time and Part-time, by Major Occupational Group, Nova Scotia, 2007
