Applicant's Agreement

The Nova Scotia Fish Registry in its decision reserves the right to accept or reject any entry and all decisions of the Registry are final. The Registry reserves the right to review, investigate, reject, disqualify or accept any declaration of record submitted or any inadvertently granted. In case of a dispute, the Registry shall be the final authority. In submitting an application, the angler voluntarily submits to the options of the Registry. In submitting this application, the applicant agrees to allow the Nova Scotia Fish Registry to use photos and statements of facts for publication and broadcast, as it deems fit.

Reminder: Photos of Catch

Three (3) clear, color photos showing a full-length side view of the fish must accompany each entry:

1. A photo having a ruler or measuring device placed beside the fish clearly showing the fish's length.
2. A photo having a tape measure around the fattest part of the fish, clearly showing its girth.
3. A photo of the angler holding the fish.

Measuring Your Fish

- A Total length measured from the tip of the snout (closed mouth) to the tip of the slightly pinched tail.
- B Girth measured around the fattest part of the body of the fish.
