### LOW INCOME PHARMACARE FOR CHILDREN

The Nova Scotia Department of Community Services will provide pharmacare coverage for children in low income families, beginning October 1, 2006. Program applications for the Low Income Pharmacare for Children program are now available for families with children under 18 years of age who receive the Nova Scotia Child Benefit and have a household income below \$20,921. There will be a \$5.00 co-pay for each prescription. Children who are beneficiaries of the Low Income Pharmacare program will be identified by their personal Nova Scotia Health card number. The child's Health Card Number is to be used for submitting pharmacy claims to the Low Income Pharmacare program for Children.

Applications were mailed in September to all families in the province currently receiving the Nova Scotia Child Benefit.

**What is Low Income Pharmacare For Children?**

The Nova Scotia government is funding a new program which will provide pharmacare coverage for children of low income families.

Beginning October 1, 2006, Low Income Pharmacare for Children is available for families who receive the Nova Scotia Child Benefit and have a household income below \$20,921. Families will pay \$5 per prescription - no matter how much the medication costs.

**Who is eligible for Low Income Pharmacare for Children?**

Low income children's pharmacare is available to families with children under the age of 18, who receive the Nova Scotia Child Benefit and have a household income below \$20,921.

**Does Community Services provide drug coverage for anyone else?**

The Department of Community Services provides pharmacare coverage for more than 50,000 people who receive assistance from the department including income assistance, services for persons with disabilities and family and children's services.

Government also plans to introduce a pharmacare program for working families in 2008.

**How do I apply?**

Applications for Low Income Pharmacare for Children will be mailed to all families who receive the Nova Scotia Child Benefit in early September 2006. **What is the Nova Scotia Child Benefit?**

The Nova Scotia Child Benefit is the provincial government's contribution to the federal National Child Benefit (NCB). The Nova Scotia Child Benefit is a tax-free monthly payment made to qualifying families with children under the age of 18.

**What if I receive "partial" Nova Scotia Child Benefits, do I still qualify for Low Income Pharmacare for Children?**

Yes, any family who qualifies for assistance from the Nova Scotia Child Benefit and does not already have pharmacare coverage is eligible for low income children's pharmacare.

**How do I qualify for the Nova Scotia Child Benefit?**

To qualify for the Nova Scotia Child Benefit you must file your income tax return each year. For families with a new child, to start receiving the Child Tax Benefit you have to make an initial application to the Canada Revenue Agency.
