I certify that the Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia, pursuant to Section 9 of Chapter 308 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Natural Products Act*, as delegated pursuant to clause 11(d) of the Act in subsection 7(1) of the *Nova Scotia Chicken Marketing Plan*, N.S. Reg. 241/82, at a meeting held on August 5, 2010, voted to amend the *Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 11/2005, made by the Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia and approved by the Natural Products Marketing Council on December 8, 2004, in the manner set out in Schedule "A", effective on and after October 1, 2010.

Schedule "A"

**Amendment to the *Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia Regulations*
made by the Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia pursuant to
Sections 9 and 11 of Chapter 308 of the
Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,
the *Natural Products Act***

- 1 (1) Section 2 of the *Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 11/2005, made by the Chicken Farmers of Nova Scotia and approved by the Natural Products Marketing Council on December 8, 2004, is amended by striking out the clause letter immediately preceding each definition.
- (2) Section 2 of the regulations is further amended by
 - (a) repealing the definition of "licensing period" and substituting the following:

“licensing period” means April 1 to November 30 in a calendar year during which a specialty chicken producer is licensed to market the type of specialty chicken specified in their licence;

- (b) adding the following definition immediately after the definition of “marketing period”:

“organic chicken” means any variety of chicken raised under an organic production system that is

- (i) based on the Canadian Organic Standards published by the Canadian General Standards Board,
- (ii) certified by a certification body accredited under the *Organic Products Regulations* made under the *Canada Agricultural Products Act* (Canada), and
- (iii) recognized by the Commodity Board and the Council;

- (c) adding the following definitions immediately after the definition of “special licence”:

“specialty chicken” means chicken that is not produced under a producer licence and that is designated by the Commodity Board as specialty chicken, and includes free range chicken and organic chicken;

“specialty licence” means a licence issued by the Commodity Board to a producer of specialty chicken to produce and market the type of specialty chicken specified on the licence;

- 2 Subsection 5(b) of the regulations is renumbered as subsection 5(4) and is amended by striking out “clause 5(2)(a)” and substituting “subsection 5(3)”.
- 3 (1) Subsection 9(3)(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “and, if required, the license fee prescribed in subsection (4)”.
- (2) Subsections 9(3) to (6) of the regulations and their headings are further amended by
- (a) beginning with the heading “Categories of licences”, are repealed and the following headings and subsections substituted:

Categories of licences

- (4) The following are the types of licences issued by the Commodity Board:

- (a) producer licence;
- (b) producer-vendor licence;
- (c) vendor licence;
- (d) special licence; and
- (e) specialty licence.

Applying for licence

- (5) A person must submit a completed application to the Commodity Board, on a form approved by the Commodity Board, for each type of licence sought.

Transferring licence

(6) Before transferring a licence, a person must apply for approval of the transfer by submitting an application to the Commodity Board on a form approved by the Commodity Board and within the time limit prescribed by the Commodity Board, and paying the licence transfer fee prescribed by the Commodity Board.

(7) Special licences and specialty licences are not transferable.

4 Subsection 14(2) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:

(2) Before a specialty licence is issued, the applicant must pay to the Commodity Board

(a) a fee of \$0.08 per chicken, plus any applicable taxes;

(b) the fee for the cost of special labels issued by the Commodity Board; and

(c) a licence fee of \$25.00.

5 Section 15 of the regulations is repealed and the following Section substituted:

15 Each person who sells chicks in the regulated area must pay to the Commodity Board a fee of \$0.10 for each chick sold to any person who does not hold a licence.

6 Section 17 of the regulations and the headings included in Section 17 are repealed and the following Section and headings substituted:

Specialty licence

17 (1) A specialty licence must state all of the following:

(a) the producer's name;

(b) the licensing period;

(c) the number of chicken licensed to be produced; and

(d) the type of chicken to be produced.

Facility inspection

(2) Before issuing a specialty licence, the Commodity Board may visit, examine, measure and photograph the producer's facilities to ensure they conform with the requirements that apply to the type of specialty chicken the producer is licensed to produce.

Underproduction

(3) A specialty licence holder who markets less than 92% of the chicken that their specialty licence permits them to produce during a licensing period is eligible for only the amount of their proven production plus 10% as the maximum amount to be marketed in the following licensing period.

Extenuating circumstances

(4) A specialty licence holder who claims that there were extenuating circumstances for underproduction must provide a detailed explanation to the Commodity Board outlining the circumstances that led to the underproduction of chicken.

No base quota conferred

- (5) A specialty licence does not entitle a producer to any rights other than those specifically stated in the specialty licence and does not confer any rights to receive base quota.

- 7 Subsection 18(7) of the regulations is amended by striking out “a producer licence or a special licence” and substituting “a licence”.

And whereas the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (“Board”) considered the manner in which it would proceed to set petroleum prices in its decision, 2006 NSUARB 108, issued on October 16, 2006;

And whereas the average of the average of the daily high and low reported product prices (in Canadian cents) for the week ended September 15, 2010, are:

Now therefore the Board prescribes the benchmark prices for petroleum products to be:

And now therefore the Board prescribes the prices for petroleum products as set forth in Schedule “A” effective on and after 12:01 a.m., September 17, 2010.

**Schedule 8 - Regulations for Specified Areas
made under Sections 9 and 14 of the
Dairy Industry Act, S.N.S. 2000, c. 24**

1 Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding the following:

In subsection 10(c) only, "non-pricing tools" means an incentive provided under a customer loyalty marketing program for the discount purchase or giveaway of goods or services.

2 A Subsection 10(c) of the regulations is repealed and replaced by the following:

(c) The use of coupons and other non-pricing tools used by manufacturers and retailers of fluid milk products are only permitted where the promotion is generic and does not promote any specific dairy brand nor cause the price paid by the consumer to fall below the regulated minimum price when the value of the coupon or other non-pricing tool is deducted from the retail price.

B Subsection 10(d) of the regulations is repealed and replaced with the following:

(d) Fluid milk products cannot be given away as part of any marketing or promotional programs except for sampling purposes and the sponsorship of charity events.

**Regulations Respecting Exemption from Examination and Licensing
made by the Minister of Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations
under subsection 65(6) of Chapter 293 of the
Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Motor Vehicle Act***

Citation

1 These regulations may be cited as the *Exemption from Examination and Licensing Regulations*.

Definitions

2 In these regulations,

- (a) “Act” means the *Motor Vehicle Act*;
- (b) “home country” of a person means the country in which the person has citizenship;
- (c) “international driving permit” means a permit issued by a foreign country under the terms of the *United Nations 1949 Convention on Road Traffic* attesting that the permit holder possesses a valid driver’s license issued by a competent authority in the permit holder’s home country;
- (d) “work permit” means a permit issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada under the *Immigration and Refugee Act* [(Canada)] that allows a person to work in Nova Scotia for a specified period of time.

Exemption for seasonal agricultural workers

3 (1) A resident may drive on a highway in the Province without a driving examination or a driver’s license issued under the Act if the resident

- (a) is a citizen of
 - (i) Barbados,
 - (ii) Jamaica, or
 - (iii) Mexico;
 - (b) is residing in Canada under a work permit and is employed to work on a farm in the Province;
 - (c) has been issued a driver’s license from their home country, and the driver’s license has not been revoked or suspended;
 - (d) is at least 16 years old; and
 - (e) has in their possession an international driving permit that was issued within the previous 12 months by their home country.
- (2) A resident exempted by this Section from the requirements for a driving examination and a driver’s license may drive only a motor vehicle of the class specified on their international driving permit.

Suspension or revocation

4 A resident whose privilege of obtaining a driver’s license has been revoked or suspended under the Act is not entitled to rely on any exemption in these regulations.

**Amendment to the *Drug Schedule Regulations* adopted by
the Council of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists pursuant
to s. 78 of the *Pharmacy Act*, subject to disallowance
by the Minister of Health and not disallowed**

The *Drug Schedules Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 164/2003, made by the Council of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists subject to disallowance by the Minister of Health are amended as follows:

1. Schedule I of the *Drug Schedules Regulations* made under Section 78 of the *Pharmacy Act* is repealed and the following Schedule is substituted for it:

Schedule I

- 1 The drugs and medicines in this Schedule are the drugs listed from time to time in Schedule I of the National Drug Schedules, which are part of Canada's National Drug Scheduling System published by the National Association of Pharmacy Regulatory Authorities, as that Schedule is from time to time amended.
- 2 The drugs and medicines in this Schedule require a prescription as a condition of sale other than drugs listed in Part II of Schedule F of the *Food and Drug Regulations* (Canada) that are not in a form suitable for use by a human or for which the main product panel of both the inner label and the outer label clearly indicate that the drug is for veterinary use only.
- 3 The drugs and medicines in this Schedule, which are listed in the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* (Canada) and its regulations, must be sold in accordance with the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* (Canada) and its regulations, and the standards of practice from time to time approved by the Council.
- 4 The drugs and medicines in this Schedule, which are not listed in the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act* (Canada) and its regulations, must be sold in accordance with the *Food and Drugs Act* (Canada) and its regulations, and the standards of practice from time to time approved by the Council.

2. Schedule IV of the Regulations is repealed.
