Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to Section 12 of the *Justices of the Peace Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Justice dated March 4, 2011, and pursuant to Section 12 of Chapter 244 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Justices of the Peace Act*, is pleased to amend the *Justices of the Peace Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 51/2002, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2002-159, dated March 28, 2002, to reflect the new summary offence ticket process provided for in amendments to the *Summary Proceedings Act* and the *Summary Offence Tickets Regulations* in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 1, 2011.

**Schedule "A"**

**Amendment to the *Justices of the Peace Regulations* made by the Governor in Council pursuant to Section 12 of Chapter 244 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Justices of the Peace Act***

- 1 (1) Section 4 of the *Justices of the Peace Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 51/2002, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2002-159 dated March 28, 2002, is further amended by repealing clause (eb) and substituting the following clause:



- (eb) in respect of an offence under a Provincial enactment for which a summary offence ticket has been issued,
  - (i) enter a conviction and impose a penalty and any applicable charge in accordance with subsection 8(15) of the *Summary Proceedings Act*, including an increased penalty in accordance with subsection 8(15A) of the *Summary Proceedings Act*, or
  - (ii) quash a proceeding in accordance with subsection 8(15) of the *Summary Proceedings Act*;
- (2) Section 4 of the regulations is further amended by adding the following clause immediately after clause (eb):
  - (ec) sign a certificate striking out a conviction under subsection 8(17A) of the *Summary Proceedings Act*;
- 2 Clause 7(p) of the regulations is repealed and the following clause substituted:
  - (p) hear an application to strike out a conviction under subsection 8(18) of the *Summary Proceedings Act*;
- 3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Section immediately after Section 4:
  - 4A** Despite the amendments to these regulations made effective April 1, 2011, these regulations as they existed immediately before April 1, 2011, apply to a summary offence ticket summons served before April 1, 2011, and, for greater certainty, these regulations shall be read, interpreted and construed with respect to any such ticket summons and related information and proceedings as if these regulations were not amended by the amendments to these regulations made effective April 1, 2011.

Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 dated January 18, 2001, in the manner set forth in Schedule "A" attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 1, 2011.

- 1 The *Summary Offence Ticket[s] Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 4/2001, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2001-21 dated January 18, 2001, are amended by
- (a) renumbering Section 9 as subsection 9(1);
  - (b) striking out "Costs where" in the heading to Section 9 and substituting "When"; and
  - (c) adding the following subsections immediately after subsection 9(1):
    - (2) The fee for an application to strike out a conviction under subsection 8(18) of the Act is
      - (a) for a single application, \$50.00;
      - (b) for all applications for 2 or more convictions entered on the same day, \$75.00.
    - (3) A certificate of a justice striking out a conviction for the purpose of subsection 8(17A) and under 8(18) shall be in Form A-2.
- 2 Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding the following subsection immediately after subsection (2):
- (3) Despite the amendments to these regulations made effective April 1, 2011, these regulations as they existed immediately before April 1, 2011, apply to a summary offence ticket summons served before April 1, 2011, and, for greater certainty, these regulations shall be read, interpreted and construed with respect to any such ticket summons and related information and proceedings as if these regulations were not amended by the amendments to these regulations made effective April 1, 2011.
- 3 The regulations are further amended by adding the following Sections immediately after Section 10:
- Plea of guilty on summons**
- 10A** For the purposes of subsection 9(2) of the Act, the form of a plea of guilty on a summons shall be in the form set forth on the ticket prescribed under subsection 10(1).
- Notice of intention to appear**
- 10B** A notice of intention to appear for the following purposes shall be in Form A-1:
- (a) for the purpose of pleading guilty to an offence and making a submission as to penalty;
  - (b) for the purpose of entering a plea of not guilty and having a trial of the matter.
- 4 Schedule 1 to the regulations is amended by
- (a) repealing Form A and substituting Form A attached; and
  - (b) adding the attached Forms A-1 and A-2 immediately after Form A.

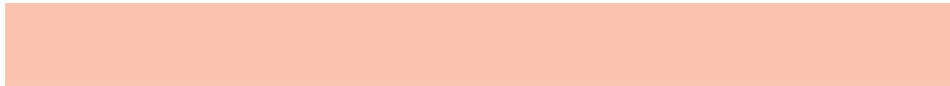
