Venture Capital Tax Credit Regulations—amendment

Order in Council 2023-306 dated November 7, 2023

Amendment to regulations made by the Governor in Council  
pursuant to subsection 37B(18) of the *Income Tax Act*

The Governor in Council on the report and recommendation of the Minister of Finance and Treasury Board dated September 29, 2023, and pursuant to subsection 37B(18) of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989, the *Income Tax Act*, is pleased to amend the *Venture Capital Tax Credit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 173/2020, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2020-310 dated November 17, 2020, to replace the term “major shareholder” with “major investor”, amend the criteria for eligible investors, amend the requirements for a qualifying venture capital fund’s application for approval of the raising of equity capital and make other administrative changes, in the manner set forth in Schedule “A” attached to and forming part of the report and recommendation, effective on and after April 1, 2019.

**Schedule “A”****Amendment to the *Venture Capital Tax Credit Regulations*  
made by the Governor in Council under subsection 37B(18)  
of Chapter 217 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1989,  
the *Income Tax Act***

1 Section 2 of the *Venture Capital Tax Credit Regulations*, N.S. Reg. 173/2020, made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council 2020-310 dated November 17, 2020, is amended by

(a) adding the following definition where it belongs in alphabetical order:

“major investor” means,

- (i) in relation to a corporation, a person whose shares in the corporation, together with any shares owned by the person’s affiliates, carry, in the aggregate, 10% or more of any voting rights attached to the shares in the corporation, and
- (ii) in relation to a limited partnership, a person whose limited partnership units, together with any limited partnership units owned by the person’s affiliates, carry, in the aggregate, 10% or more of any voting rights attached to the limited partnership units in the limited partnership;

(b) repealing the definition of “major shareholder”.

2 Clause 5(1)(c) of the regulations is repealed.

3 Subsection 9(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following subsection substituted:

- (1) A qualifying venture capital fund must not make or hold an investment in a qualifying small business if a major investor in the qualifying venture capital fund is, or was at any time during the 2 years immediately preceding the investment, any of the following:

- (a) a major investor in the qualifying small business;
  - (b) an affiliate of a major investor in the qualifying small business;
  - (c) the qualifying small business or an affiliate of the qualifying small business.
- 4 Subsection 14(1) of the regulations is amended by renumbering it as Section 14.
- 5 Clause 15(1)(f) of the regulations is repealed and the following clause substituted:
- (f) a statement signed by an authorized officer of the qualifying small business which confirms that the qualifying small business
    - (i) meets the criteria set out in Section 7, and
    - (ii) will not use the investment proceeds for a purpose described in subsection 10(1);
- 6 Clause 20(2)(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “Atlantic Canada” and substituting “Nova Scotia”.
- 7 Clause 26(a) of the regulations is amended by striking out “Atlantic Canada” and substituting “Nova Scotia”.
- 8 Subsection 27(2) of the regulations is amended by striking out “90 days” and substituting “6 months”.
