Updates - The FRPA Review Office has been busy engaging the regulatory bodies in preparation for pilot reviews (on a volunteer basis) which will be taking place early in the new year.

The FRPA ad hoc advisory committee has been re-assembled to act as a vehicle for communication, advice and support between NS regulatory bodies and government. The committee has already met twice and will be meeting again before the next breakfast meeting to review the FRPA Review Questions.

A one day <u>Plain language training</u> course was offered in September. There was a lot of interest so we are currently looking at developing a webinar to enable us to offer more successful plain language training and to reach a broader audience.

Natash Pateman from Citizenship and Immigration Canada, visited NS in October to talk about <u>federal immigration policy changes</u>. The session was well attended and we will continue to bring them in to inform us on new developments.

2012-13 Annual Report

The FRPA Annual Report will be tabled in the House of Commons this Fall. This report includes highlights of 2011-12 accomplishments, including work related to Chapter 7 of the Agreement on Internal Trade and International Qualifications Recognition (IQR), and work planned for 2012-13.
