



SELECT COMMITTEE on Establishing an Electoral Boundaries Commission

An all-party select committee of the Nova Scotia legislature is seeking public input on the terms of reference for a commission which will review the province's electoral boundaries.

The select committee does not determine the redistribution of electoral boundaries. The committee is seeking views on the following:

- 1) the composition of the *Provincial Electoral Boundaries Commission*
- 2) the terms of reference for the commission
- 3) the timeline for a completed report from the commission

The select committee will hold public meetings between November 13 and November 22 in the locations below. Meetings will be held from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., with evening sessions beginning at 7 p.m.
