Registration of Undertaking for Environmental Assessment ENVIRONMENT ACT

This is to advise that on September 10, 2019, Nova Scotia Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal registered the Highway 102 Aerotech Connector Road Project for environmental assessment, in accordance with Part IV of the *Environment Act*.

The proposed Project involves the construction, maintenance and post-construction monitoring of a 5-kilometer (km) Connector Road from Highway 102 Aerotech Interchange (Exit 5A) to Trunk 2 in Wellington near Sunnylea Road. The Connector is designed as a four lane road but will be built with two main travel lanes with an additional climbing lane in some road segments, an active transportation trail offset from the road, access to each parcel of land between Highway 102 and the old Holland Road (total of 3 intersections), roundabout at the ramp terminal at Exit 5A, and roundabout at the intersection with Trunk 2.

The Project construction may commence in 2020 and is expected to be completed within 5 years. This Project will alleviate traffic congestion in the Fall River area while improving the connectivity of the highway network between Highway 102 and Trunk 2. The Aerotech connector is the next piece of infrastructure recommended by the 2009 transportation study, following the construction of the Fall River roundabout at Exit 5, which was completed in 2014.
