# **Environmental Assessment of the Proposed Black Point Quarry Project**

### **Public Comment Period**

Black Point Aggregates Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Vulcan Materials Company, is proposing the construction, operation, decommissioning, and abandonment of a granite quarry at Black Point in Guysborough County, Nova Scotia, and the construction and operation of a 200 metre-long marine terminal and load-out facility, adjacent to the quarry, in Chedabucto Bay. Construction is anticipated to commence in 2018. The quarry is expected to have a production capacity of up to 7.5 million tonnes of granite per year, over a mine life of approximately 50 years.

The proposed Black Point Quarry Project is subject to both the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*, 2012 and *Nova Scotia's Environment Act*, and is undergoing a cooperative environmental assessment process.

#### **Public Comment Period**

The Canadian Environmental Assessment Agency (the Agency) and Nova Scotia Environment's Environmental Assessment Branch invite the public to comment on the potential environmental effects of the project and the proposed measures to prevent or mitigate those effects as described in a summary of the proponent's Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).
