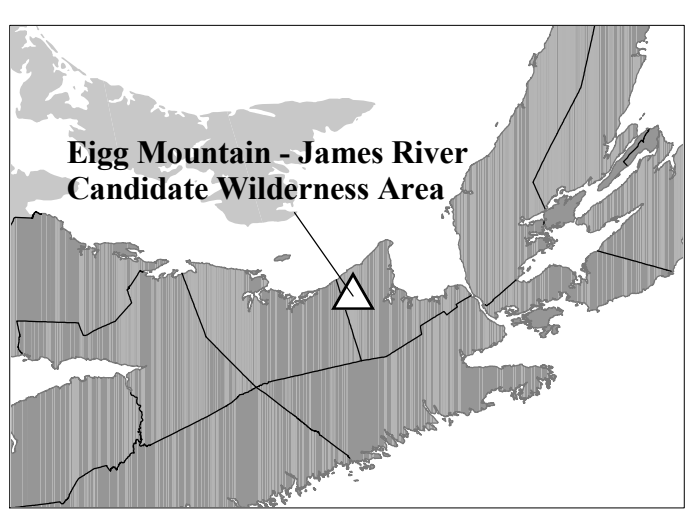


Egg Mountain - James River Candidate Wilderness Area

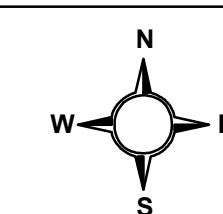
