



Lakes and lakeshore fens, like those found at Gully Lake, are an uncommon, but ecologically significant, feature of the Cobequid Mountain landscape.



The headwaters of Juniper Brook contain poorly drained spruce flats and an extensive fen system.



Juniper Brook contains a relatively rich forested floodplain/ravine ecosystem.



Gully Lake contains one of the largest remaining patches of contiguous (unfragmented) forest in northern Nova Scotia.
