Heritage Tax Grant applications must be made through the municipal office. Assistance:	30% of eligible project costs, to maximum grant of \$1,000; and maximum grant(s) of \$1,000 in any two-year period. Money disbursed 100% upon completion of the project. For those property owners with more than one registered heritage property, the maximum amount for conservation work will be limited to \$2,000 (in total) in any two-year period.	50% of eligible costs, to a maximum grant of \$1,000. For property owners with more than one registered heritage property, the maximum amount for conservation work will be limited to \$1,000 (in total) in any two-year period, and \$2,000 (in total) in any one-year period for conservation advice.	A grant in the amount of the provincial portion of the Harmonized Sales Tax (8%) spent on eligible materials and labour costs, to a maximum rebate of \$500 for work undertaken in any one year.	A rebate of the provincial portion of the Harmonized Sales Tax (8%) spent on eligible material costs, no maximum.
Eligible Project Costs:	Conservation of existing historic exterior fabric of heritage properties and structural needs (such as painting, cladding repair, roof replacement, chimney repair and repair or rebuilding of existing windows or doors that have heritage significance.)	Fees of approved conservation consultant, engaged to advise on the maintenance or restoration of the building exterior or structure.	P.S.T. paid on building materials, labour and scaffold rentals used in conservation and repair of the building exterior. Not included:	Landscaping, electrical/heating/plumbing services, new construction of a building's addition, new out/accessory building and new windows and doors that do not maintain the heritage character of the building.	All eligible applications must be made in advance of hiring a professional to provide conservation advice. No grants or disbursements will be made for work that does not meet acceptable conservation standards, as identified in the <i>Standards and Guidelines for the Conservation of Historic Places in Canada</i> .	Associated materials, construction and labour not eligible under the conservation work grant; and materials claimed under the Service Nova Scotia and Municipal Relations Rebate of the Provincial Component of the (HST) for repairs, improvement or restoration of the exterior of a heritage property.
