Keep the Lights <u>On</u> and Stay Safe.

Starting April 13, 2009, you must have your lights on when you drive on Nova Scotia roads.

It's the Law.

Daytime running lights help oncoming drivers see you better, especially when turning onto a road from a driveway or at an intersecting street. They have been shown to reduce crashes.

Check to make sure your vehicle's daytime running lights are working properly. If your vehicle does not have daytime running lights, you must use your low-beam headlights.

Help keep our roads safe by making sure your daytime running lights or low-beam headlights are on during daylight hours.
