

MORE ABOUT THIS LAW

In Nova Scotia, we are protecting our children from impaired driving

If you are convicted of impaired driving with a blood alcohol level over .08 and a child under 16 is in the car, you will:

- have a criminal record
- lose your license for at least two years
- be fined at least \$1,000
- have to complete an addictions program
- have to participate in the **Alcohol Ignition Interlock Program**
 - *at your own cost*
 - *for 12 extra months*

The Alcohol Ignition Interlock device prevents your car from starting if it detects alcohol on your breath.

Are you worried about how drinking is affecting your life—or the life of someone you care about? Addiction services are free, private, and available to all Nova Scotians.
